Dear Ms. Bartelmann,

We are in receipt of your letter dated May 5, 2026, containing a Request for Information relating to the Notice of Material Change Transaction, dated April 9, 2026, submitted by Align Capital Partners (“Align”) and Heritage Imaging LLC (“Heritage Imaging”). We have responded to each of your requests for additional information below.

**1. Please describe the relationship between Heritage Imaging, LLC and Heritage System Services.**

“Heritage System Services” is an unused tradename (i.e., “DBA” name) of Heritage Imaging. Heritage Imaging had at one point contemplated creating an equipment services division that would operate under the DBA name “Heritage System Services,” and proactively created a website (<https://heritagesystemsservices.com/>) as part of that planning. However, Heritage Imaging ultimately decided not to create or operate this business division, and Heritage Imaging has not operated under the name “Heritage System Services” in any state. Heritage Imaging deactivated the “Heritage Systems Services” website, linked to earlier, on or around May 6, 2026.

**2. Does Heritage System Services provide health care products or services in Oregon.**

Not applicable; “Heritage System Services” is not a separate entity. It is an unused and decommissioned DBA of Heritage Imaging.

**3. Please describe how the proposed transaction will affect Heritage Systems Services, including any changes to ownership, governance, services, and/or locations in Oregon.**
