Health Information Technology Oversight Council (HITOC) Context and Proposed Slate

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HITOC's Responsibilities

The Oregon Legislature created HITOC to ensure health system transformation efforts are supported by Health IT, such as electronic health records and connecting systems to coordinate care.

HITOC's responsibilities:

- 1. Set Oregon's Health IT strategy; explore/monitor Health IT policy
- 2. Assess Oregon's Health IT landscape; report on progress
- 3. Oversee OHA's Health IT efforts

Main focus 2021-2022: Update Oregon's Health IT Strategic Plan



HITOC Strategic Plan: Health IT Goals



1. Share patient information across care team



2. Use data for system improvement, value-based payment and cost containment efforts



3. Patients can access their own health information and collaborate in their care



Emerging areas: Social determinants of health; health equity



Health IT Challenges



Connecting

- EHRs still face challenges "talking to each other"
- COVID-19 showed need for connected systems with public health
- New opportunities for connecting health care and social services



Rules and Standards

- Recent federal health IT rules change the incentives/penalties and promote patient apps
- Oregon's race, ethnicity, language, disability (REALD) data standards are not implemented in EHRs



OHA's Health IT Budget transition



Spotlight: Community Information Exchange (CIE)



CIE is

- A network of healthcare and human/social service partners
- Using a technology platform to
- Electronically connect people to social services and supports

Value of CIE:

- "Closed loop" referral and social needs screening
- Connect to cultural/linguistic specific services
- Coordinate more easily across organizations
- Use data to inform policy; identify gaps in services

Focus on improving OHPB committee recruitment and retention


- July 13: informational OHPB webinar

- Slate leaves seats open for additional recruitment needed




