This SBIRT (**S**creening, **B**rief **I**ntervention, and **R**eferral to **T**reatment) webinar training series is supported by the Oregon Rural Practice-based Research Network's (ORPRN) ANTECEDENT project. ANTECEDENT focuses on addressing unhealthy alcohol use in Oregon. The project team intends to work with over 80 primary care clinics and provide each clinic with the evidence and tools they need to help patients with moderate to severe alcohol use disorder through the use of screening and brief intervention and medication assisted treatment.
