

## Data Sources for Health Assessments and Health Improvement Plans

Health assessments and improvement plans use various types of data to describe a community's health, identify key concerns, and track changes over time. This data comes from national, state, and local sources and is collected through methods like surveys, service data, interviews, and focus groups. Using these data sources helps create a comprehensive understanding of a community's health strengths and needs. Health improvement plans use this data to measure if the desired improvements are happening.

The table below lists possible data sources for health assessment and improvement planning in Oregon. It is divided into two categories: resources published by the Oregon Health Authority and those published by other organizations. Each entry includes a brief description, the availability of sub-analysis, and a link to the resource.

When reviewing data sources, consider their limitations, especially regarding validity and reliability for specific communities. If traditional data is missing for certain communities, look for more qualitative and community-based data. Also, aim to understand and practice the decolonization of data, from collection to analysis and reporting.

To monitor health improvement plans, choose "indicators" from data sources to set a baseline and measure progress. For example, one indicator could be the "Percentage of tobacco users among Oregon adults" from [Oregon's State Health Indicators](#). Good indicators should:

- Be relevant and show necessary information about the system.
- Be analyzed by subgroups (e.g., race/ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability, geography, income) to show disparities.
- Be easy to understand, even for non-experts.
- Be reliable and trustworthy.
- Be based on accessible data that can be gathered in time to take action.
