1. Updates from the Transformation Center

CAC member-CCO Governing Board Learning Collaborative:

- The Transformation Center will be able to provide a \$25 gift card per participant per meeting for the new learning collaborative. One meeting participant suggested this amount should be bumped up to \$40 or \$50/session. Tom Cogswell offered to look into whether this would be feasible.
- Tom Cogswell will be determining the type of gift or prepaid card in the next few weeks. Suzanne Cross offered that [PEX cards](#) might be a good option for this project, as cards can be re-loaded and used at more than one store. Several consumer CAC members also shared that it would be more helpful to receive a prepaid card that could be used at more than one store.
- Rather than meeting once month, this learning collaborative would meet six total times, every other month, starting in either August or September
- Several participants asked whether it would be possible for non-CAC governing board members to participate in the collaborative. Examples given were CAC chairs or co-chairs who might be expected to take on this leadership position in the future. Tom Cogswell offered to look into this could be an option.

- Tom Cogswell will send out the final learning collaborative announcement to CAC coordinators within the next few weeks to distribute to CAC governing board members. This announcement will include a list of potential meeting topics so potential participants can get a better sense of what will be discussed during meetings.

Fall 2020 CAC Conference:

- The Transformation Center has officially cancelled the fall 2020 CAC Conference due to COVID-19. One meeting participant asked if the conference could be hosted online or via Zoom. Tom Cogswell offered to look into whether this would be feasible.

2. CAC 101 Presentation Review

- Meeting participants provided feedback on the [draft CAC 101 presentation](#). The audience for this presentation includes new and existing CAC members. The goals of the presentation are to 1) provide an overview of CCOs, 2) describe CAC's role in advising CCOs, and 3) provide an overview of CAC supports from the Transformation Center. This presentation has been updated with new information from CCO 2.0 about CAC's roles.
- Feedback included:
 - Provide a clearer definition of what a CCO is (i.e., "network of all health care providers")
 - Reduce the overall content and time if possible or consider creating a shorter 5-10 minute version of the presentation
- Candy Rosenberg and Michelle Thurston volunteered to record short 45-second videos to be added to the CAC presentation. In these videos, these CAC members should share how they joined their CAC and what being a CAC means to them. After these videos are recorded and additional edits are made to the presentation, Tom Cogswell will share the final recorded presentation to collaborative members.

4. Virtual CAC Meeting Check-In

- CAC members shared what their experience has been like thus far participating in virtual CAC meetings. Comments included:
 - Connecting via video with other CAC members has been fun, and has brightened people's days
 - Hosting meetings online has allowed for greater CAC member participation in some cases
 - Meeting virtually has also allowed some individuals in rural areas to be able to attend meetings more consistently
 - Icebreakers at the beginning of meetings have been helpful for CAC members
