

## Oregon Health Authority Technical Assistance for Clinics, CCOs and Health Systems

### Supporting Kindergarten Readiness

**Background:** As of January 2020, coordinated care organizations have a new set of incentive measures, two of which are designed to support kindergarten readiness:

- 1) Well-child visits for 3–6-year-olds; and
- 2) Preventive dental visits for ages 1–5.

The Transformation Center will be providing technical assistance to support meeting these measures.

<b>Webinar series: Increasing well child visits for ages 3–6</b>	
<b>January 16, noon–1 p.m.</b>	<p><b>Reach Out and Read Early Literacy Program, A Proven Model</b></p> <p>Reach Out and Read is a national early literacy program that integrates reading aloud into pediatric care. Medical providers trained in the model provide families with understanding and tools to make reading part of their daily routine. Through multiple peer-reviewed studies, the program has been shown to further language acquisition, improve school readiness, increase the time children and their caregivers spend reading together and, most recently, improve well-child visit attendance. <b>February 5, 11 a.m.– noon</b>	<p><b>Well-child Visit Peer Sharing: Child Wellness Campaign, Gap Reporting/Closure, and Provider Engagement</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Eastern Oregon Coordinated Care Organization quality improvement staff will present their new hybrid Child Wellness Campaign. This member outreach uses multiple channels to impact several CCO incentive measures – including well-child visits, preventive dental services and immunizations. Presenters will discuss designing a project plan to address multiple measures, creating audience-appropriate content, and working with external partners to broaden the scope of incentive measure improvement projects.</li> <li>• InterCommunity Health Network CCO staff will review IHN’s process for building and verifying reporting on measure data and how IHN shares that data back to providers, collaborates around accuracy of findings, and gains insights into improved reporting.</li> </ul>
