How does communication work support the purpose of the system-level SEH Metric?

Communication is key to changing the system but there are still legitimate challenges

- Stigma-having to seek Mental Health services for your very young child is a reflection on your parenting. Hard to acknowledge
- Repeated messaging-we are bombarded with social media advertising and yet there is not enough messaging regarding infant and early childhood social-emotional health and it's impact on well being
- There is still the belief that infants and young children do not remember
- Competing with many other deserving system level initiatives





What are you learning?

This metric is in 4 phases and would have had better outcomes if we started with the Early Learning providers in Phase I and allowed them to develop our priorities

We need to create a marketing campaign on a state and global level

SEH of children, ages 0-5, is just one of many initiatives our CCO's and provider network is managing. (little people-little problems)

We need to focus on alternative methods to helping parents and their young children (this currently happens within EC Programs

This metric is challenging to implement and we need to concentrate on additional funding for all our early learning programs, including child care providers





Any plans or next steps for continuing communication work?

YCCO's BH Department will be offering scholarships to clinicians: PSU's Infant and Early Childhood MH Certificate Program, Child Parent Psychotherapy,

Continue to provide Child level data to Primary Care, BH, Head Start, Relief Nurseries, etc....

- CCO should have organized clear information on what SBH is available for b-5 for different audiences
- Use social complexity data to be proactive in outreach to families – how to connect parents getting services to consider young child

Screening and Assessments

- Need for training of Primary Care and staff on Social-Emotional Health
 - Identify best practices for screening/assessment
- Hire THW/CHW that are culturally specific to help conduct screening and/or assessments
- Screening fatigue and unclear recommendations
- Leverage CBOs who are already screening

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✓ Evidence-based interventions for impacting early childhood social-emotional delays/concerns

 \checkmark Referral to specialty behavioral health when needed

48 Integrated Behavioral Health Attended representing 31 primary care sites



Second year deliverables: Socialemotional health metric

WHAT: Updated asset map. Per the table on page 5 of the 2023 technical specifications, this includes **both** -

- (i) an updated version of what CCOs submitted for Year 1/2022 (contracted specialty behavioral health services) and
- (ii) asset map for integrated behavioral health services (contracted Patient Centered Primary Care Homes who have attested to the PCPCH standards with Standard 3C3 to indicate that they provide integrated behavioral health services, including population-based, same-day consultations by behavioral health providers).
 - While CCOs do not have to use the asset map forms from the measure specification appendices or the fillable versions provided by OHA, CCO submissions must, at a minimum, include the elements noted in the measure specifications.
 - Therefore, CCOs may choose to submit separate documents (updated contracted specialty behavioral health services assets document and separate integrated behavioral health assets document) or, if they choose, one document including the required information on both types of assets.

WHAT: Updated action plan. Per the table on page 10 of the 2023 technical specifications, CCOs must submit an updated action plan assessing progress (per page 11.

• This includes assessing progress measured by meeting progress milestones the CCO set in the Action Plan and involving communities experiencing injustices in evaluating the success of improvement strategies and offering suggestions for revising the targets and strategies in the Action Plan.
