

CCO Housing Investments: Supporting Health for All through RE-investment (SHARE) Initiative and Health-Related Services (HRS)



SHARE Initiative – Housing Investments

In 2020, CCOs designated ~\$4.8 million through the SHARE Initiative.

Approximately 75% of 2020 SHARE investments are housing related:

- Temporary housing
- Housing supports and services
- Create affordable housing

- Shelter services
- Job/workforce support
- Housing improvements/repairs



2021 HRS – Housing Spending

In 2021, CCOs spent **\$31,137,862 on Health-Related Services**. Of that total, CCOs invested **\$5,935,722 into housing**:
