

Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Continuing Education for Providers

The Integrated COD Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR 309-019-0145 and OAR 309-018-0160) require approved ICOD practitioners to complete two to four hours (at discretion of OHA ICOD program on a yearly basis) of continuing education in approved ICOD trainings. For 2026, ICOD practitioners that have been registered for more than two years must take a minimum of two approved credit hours of continuing education.

The schedule of live, zoom based trainings is below. Each training provides 2.0 MHACBO CEU's. Recorded trainings will be available November 4th, 2026. OHA-ICOD HIGHLY encourages participation in the live trainings.

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The Syndrome Model of Addiction

In recent years Howard Shaffer, PhD (Harvard) and other addiction researchers have developed what has become known as the "Syndrome Model of Addiction". At its core, this model distills the common factors implicated in addictions -- be they substance specific or process specific -- and seeks to develop treatment approaches that address these common factors. This training will explore the development and core factors of the model and provide some first steps in treatment approaches informed by the model.

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Traumatic Brain Injury and Co-Occurring Disorders

Traumatic Brain Injury has wide and varied impact on people's functioning and orientation to themselves, others and society. Often people dealing with TBI have co-occurring conditions with their mental health and are more vulnerable to developing addictions.
