*2022 Competitive Housing Development Request for Grant Applications (RFGA)*

Licensed Residential Treatment Homes or Facilities

### Notices

The two RFGAs posted to the OHA SDOH webpage Friday, April 29, 2022 for contained this paragraph on page 1:

The not-to-exceed amount that OHA HSD may award collectively under this RFGA and the RFGA for Licensed Residential Treatment Homes or Facilities, both posted on April 29, 2022, is **\$101 million**.

A change has been made in the amount stated. The not-to-exceed amount OHA HSD may award collectively under both RFGAs posted is **\$112 million**.

The RFGA posted to the OHA SDOH Webpage Friday April 29, 2022 contained this information on page 5 under the real property development project design and operations requirements.

The eligible residential settings include community-based homes or facilities licensed by OHA as one of the following:

- Residential Treatment Home (RTH) for up to 5 individuals.
- Residential Treatment Facility (RTF) for 6 up to 15 individuals
- Secure Residential Treatment Facility (SRTF) for up to 15 individuals.

A change has been made in the amount stated residential treatment facility (RTF) for 6 up to **16** individuals. Secure Residential Treatment Facility (SRTF) for up to **16** individuals.

# Questions + Answers

## Housing Type and Population

1. **Q:** Would you kindly confirm whether this RFGA for LRTS is for new beds only, or if funds could be dedicated to rehabilitating an existing LRTS with significant need for health and safety upgrades?

**A:** The RFGA for Licensed Residential Treatment Homes or Facilities is to be used to increase bed capacity

2. **Q:** Can the funds be used to purchase an existing RTF that is for sale and could potentially close down if not purchased?

**A:** If the purchase of the RTF funded by an award will result in new beds at the time the RTF is occupied it would be eligible. If there is no increase in bed capacity resulting from the purchase of the RTF, it would not be eligible.
