Regional Development & Innovation Initiative



Funded under HB 5024

Includes \$65 million in one-time funds available through the American Rescue Plan Act and \$65 million General Funds.

- This 2021-2023 initiative is an investment to increase:
 - Oregon's licensed residential treatment and supportive housing for people with behavioral health service needs
- Funds support capital, startup, and operational costs
- Implemented through a phased rollout with oversight and consultation at all steps of planning and implementation
- First Request for Proposal issued on December 30, 2021
- The next RFGA will be issued on April 29, 2022

Community Engagement

Planning Grants:

- \$5 million in Planning Grants 104 awards:
 - \$50,000 each, to community mental health programs, tribes, Regional Health Equity Coalitions, and other community organizations
- To conduct research and identify community needs
- Assess the feasibility of potential projects
- Conduct other planning activities aimed at increasing residential facility and housing capacity



COMMUNITY

April 29, 2022, Request for Grant Applications (RFGA)

- The April 29, 2022, RFGA is for one-time funding for two types of housing serving people with a serious and persistent mental illness:
 - <u>Supportive Housing</u> is independent rental housing with services. Eligible uses of the funds include new construction or acquisition of an existing building and renovation.
 - <u>Licensed Residential Homes and Facilities</u> provide a high-level of care with 24/7 staffing. Eligible uses of funds include new construction or acquisition of an existing building and renovation. Additional funding available is for startup to support the setting-up of a home or facility and the first two months of operations including staff recruitment and training.



Request for Grant Applications (RFGA) Process Timeline:

	RFGA Dates	RFGA Process
1	04/29/22 – 07/29/22	RFGA for acquisition, construction, renovation, and startup expenses are posted for 3 months.
1a	08/01/22 – 08/31/22	Applications are evaluated and respectively awarded.
2	09/01/22 – 11/30/22	RFGA for acquisition, construction, renovation, and startup expenses are posted for 3 months.
2a	12/01/22 – 12/31/22	Applications are evaluated and respectively awarded.
3	01/01/23 – 03/31/23	RFGA for acquisition, construction, renovation, and startup expenses are posted for 3 months.
3a	04/01/23 - 04/30/23	Applications are evaluated and respectively awarded.



FAQ Responses



- The December 30, 2021, Request for Proposal (RFP) for licensed residential treatment facilities focused on 4 priority populations: 1. Aid & Assist, 2. Guilty Except Insanity, 3. Civil Commitment, 4. Children with Severe Emotional Disturbance (SED).
 - The April 29, 2022, RFGA is broader than the December 30, 2021, RFP.
- The evaluation team will be selected based on their wellrounded level of subject matter expertise respective to the requirements of the application.
 - Attention will be paid to ensuring representation of perspectives and experiences.
- With the goal of ensuring access throughout Oregon, geographic representation of residential treatment will be a consideration of the RFGA and awards.
