Subject: Intensive In-Home Behavioral Health Treatment (IIBHT) Provider Learning Collaborative

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) will be facilitating an IIBHT Learning Collaborative for child outpatient mental health providers interested in providing IIBHT. The focus of the collaborative is to bring together community stakeholders to discuss and brainstorm successful strategies for implementing this level of care.

Topics may include:

- The role of child psychiatry in IIBHT
- Rural vs Urban service delivery
- Program and Outcome Data
- Preauthorization Process
- Other provider questions

Why is this happening?

IIBHT is new Medicaid level of care for children enrolled in the Oregon Health Plan. The IIBHT Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 309-019-0167, 410-172-0650 and 410-172-0695 are now live. OHA Certification Team is actively working with providers to have IIBHT added to their Certificate of Approval (COA). IIBHT is now available for children with Oregon Health Plan through Open Card and CCOs will be implementing IIBHT in January 2021.
