

Regional Help & Referral Information- Eating Disorders

About this Document

The purpose of this document is to give the Oregon community a place to find information about eating disorders, including parent/caregiver resources, to help parents and caregivers understand how eating disorders are best dealt with. We have listed treatment centers, private practitioners, and other helpful resources pertaining to eating disorders. We have treatment centers listed by state on the west coast and by the level of care they offer. We have listed some of the private practitioners in Oregon and have "provider finder" resources.

Billing Medicaid

We have defined, in this document, which Oregon providers and treatment centers can bill Medicaid.

Being able to bill Medicaid depends on which Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) the patient is within, as they manage the Medicaid discernments in those CCOs.

If one is outside those CCOs in which they live, they can still contact nonlocal and outof-state treatment centers and ask if they can create a "Single Case Agreement" between the patient's Medicaid providers and the treatment center/provider. This is a frequently used mechanism.

Some treatment centers offer scholarships and financial assistance. In addition, many treatment centers provide advice related to level of care and can help one decide which level of care might work for their family member.

Levels of Care

Levels of care for those with an eating disorder refers to how intensive the treatment is, in terms of how much monitoring and oversight is necessary, to reduce and/or eliminate eating disorder behaviors. The level of care is decided upon by the whole treatment team and relates to the severity of illness and risk of harm. Medical stability is determined by a patient's Primary Care Provider.

Inpatient/ Medical Stabilization/ Hospitalization: Sometimes a person with an ED needs to be stabilized medically because they are not well enough to not be in a hospital. Medical stabilization is not treatment, it is being in a hospital because one's health is too fragile. Close monitoring and treatment are needed to ensure the person's stability. Hospitalization criteria are established and can be found here: Hospitalization Criteria



Residential: Residential treatment is needed by those who cannot reduce their eating disorder behaviors on their own. Patients live on site and have close monitoring of meals, outings and other activities to ensure the person stays safe and does not engage in eating disorder behaviors.

Partial Hospitalization Programs (PHP): Partial Hospitalization programs level of care offers 6 to 8 hours of structured care daily. The patient engages in therapies and group activities during their program, and often most meals and snacks are served and monitored during the program hours. The patient is able to go home after the program and sleep at home.

Intensive Outpatient programs (IOP): Intensive outpatient offers 3 to 5 hours of structured care daily or several days per week, with at least 1 meal served and monitored. Individual therapies and group activities are offered. This is for people who can mostly manage their behaviors on their own, or who might have family/friends help with monitoring of eating and exercise activities outside of the program. Less monitoring is needed in order for the person to not engage in eating disorder behaviors.

Outpatient Care: Outpatient care, consisting of private practitioners, is where most clients will spend the most time. Sometimes clinic care is done by individual providers. Outpatient care offers ongoing support, therapy, and monitoring of behaviors. Clients do eat on their own or with the support of family and other caregivers.

Some treatment centers offer more than one level of care.

Virtual Programs have become more popular and can offer PHP and IOP levels of care as well as outpatient virtual support groups. Evidence is strong that virtual programs are effective, allow people to remain at home, and the program can be structured around a person's work and home life needs.

Hospitalization Criteria

- **1.** ≤75% median BMI for age and sex (percent median BMI calculated as patient BMI/50th percentile BMI for age and sex in reference population)
- 2. Electrolyte disturbance (hypokalemia, hyponatremia, hypophosphatemia)
- 3. ECG abnormalities (e.g., prolonged QTc or severe bradycardia)
- **4.** Physiologic instability:
- a. Severe bradycardia (HR,50 beats per min daytime; 45 beats per min at night);
- b. Hypotension (90/45 mm Hg);
- c. Hypothermia (body temperature, 96°F, 35.6°C);
- d. Orthostatic increase in pulse (20 beats per min) or decrease in BP (.20 mm Hg systolic or .10 mm Hg diastolic)
- **5.** Arrested growth and development
- 6. Acute food refusal
- 7. Uncontrollable binge eating and purging
- 8. Acute medical complications of malnutrition (e.g., syncope, seizures, cardiac



failure, pancreatitis and so forth)

9. Comorbid psychiatric or medical condition that prohibits or limits appropriate outpatient treatment (e.g., severe depression, suicidal ideation, obsessive compulsive disorder, type 1 diabetes mellitus)
