Introduction

Background

There are many misconceptions regarding involuntary Seclusion and Restraint (S&R) practices in mental health intensive treatment facilities. In the past, these interventions were perceived as a therapeutic way to create a safer, more secure environment for consumers and staff. On the contrary, research has shown that S&R:

- Can pose psychological and physical risks to both consumers and staff (U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, 2010).
- Can have serious consequences including physical repercussions, mental repercussions and death. There is no evidence that involuntary S&R is effective in reducing problem behaviors in children (U.S. Department of Education, 2012).

The U.S Department of Health and Human Services has aimed to promote alternatives to involuntary S&R (U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, 2010). The United States, and Oregon, measure the number of S&R instances in child-caring agencies. Measuring utilization of S&R is important for tracking trends in use, monitoring progress towards elimination, and quality improvement.

Senate Bill 710 summary

The 2021 Oregon Legislature passed <u>Senate Bill 710</u> (SB 710) to further regulate the use S&R in child caring agencies. S&R should only be used when:

- A child's behavior poses a reasonable risk of imminent serious bodily injury to the child or others,
 and
- A less restrictive intervention would not effectively reduce the risk, and
- After attempts at de-escalation have failed.

Child-caring agency staff must be trained in lawful S&R practices in order to use S&R during a child's care. SB 710 modifies the allowed use of S&R of children in care and by certain programs. The bill imposes increased reporting requirements.

About this report/moving forward

This report displays the current S&R data available by child-caring agency within the Child and Family Behavioral Health Intensive Psychiatric service levels of care. Moving forward, SB 710 will require child-caring agencies to report more data on S&R including:

- Total number of involuntary seclusions in a locked room,
- Total number of rooms available for use by the program for involuntary seclusion,
- Total number of incidents of S&R that resulted in reportable injury,
- Number of children in care placed in S&R more than three times in a three-month period, and
- The demographic characteristics of children placed in S&R.

These data will be reflected in future reports related to SB 710.

Key terms

Child-caring agency: Any private school, private agency, private organization or county program providing day treatment for children with emotional disturbances, adoption placement services, residential care, outdoor youth programs, or other similar care or services for children.

Involuntary seclusion: The confinement of a child in care alone in a room from which the child in care is prevented from leaving by any means.

ITS: Intensive Treatment Services

PDTS: Psychiatric Day Treatment Services

PRTS: Psychiatric Residential Treatment Services

Restraint: The physical restriction of a child in care's actions or movements by holding the child in care or using pressure or other means.

S&R: Involuntary Seclusion & Restraint

SCIP: Secure Children's Inpatient Treatment Programs

SAIP: Secure Adolescent Inpatient Treatment Programs

Sub-Acute Psychiatric Care: Services that are provided by nationally accredited providers to children who need 24-hour intensive mental health services.


What are rates and how are they calculated?

A *rate* is a measure of the frequency with which an event occurs in a defined population over a specified period of time. For example, an involuntary seclusion rate of 3.4 per 1,000 patient days means that for every 1,000 patient days, 3.4 involuntary seclusions occur. Rates make it possible to compare S&R data across different facilities because it is adjusted for the total number of patient days that occurred in the facility.

Seclusion Rate = number of seclusions / total patient days * 1,000 Restraint Rate = number of restraints / total patient days * 1,000



OHSU Seclusion and Restraint Rates










Trillium: Children's Farm Home Seclusion and Restraint Rates






Jasper Mountain SAFE Center Seclusion and Restraint Rates








ITS Facilities Annual Rates

ITS facilities licensed to utilize S&R will be major players in the ITS data for SB 710 moving forward.


Seclusion and Restraint Rates for 2018
