Cultural Humility in Crisis Services

Workshop Descriptions*

Part 1 **DATA JUSTICE**

This workshop explores the concept of data genocide, and how gaps in data inform our beliefs about communities, what and who gets funded, and how we craft interventions.

Part 2 **FROM PROVIDER TO ACCOMPLICE: HARM REDUCTION IN MENTAL HEALTH SYSTEMS**

Participants will interrogate the ways that our current system harms community members with targeted identities, explore the history of social services work that contributes to current models, and discuss how to incorporate concepts of allyship and accompliceship into our practice.

Part 3 **DISABILITY JUSTICE & BODY SOVEREIGNTY**

We will work to articulate the Principles of Disability Justice and how we can incorporate them into our work. We will also talk about engaging in crisis response with all types of bodies, and the relationship between body autonomy and interrupting ableism within ourselves.

Part 4 **INDIGENIZED HEALING PRACTICES**

In this workshop we will explore wellness models that are coming out of targeted communities, that intrinsically center those "other ways of being and knowing." Participants will learn how to incorporate these ideas meaningfully and ethically into their practice.

Part 5 **ACUTE CARE: NOW WHAT? - BEYOND THE MOMENT OF "CRISIS"**

One of the ideas that is becoming more prevalent in Crisis Services is the idea that "care" requires a village level response. This idea, however, has always existed in BIPOC (and other) communities. In this space, we'll explore strategies to build relationships that facilitate a "village-level" collective intervention strategy.
