Which behavioral health providers are required to report in MOTS?

The data collection system for the Health Systems Division (HSD) is the Measures and Outcomes Tracking System or MOTS.

In general, behavioral health providers who are either licensed or have a letter of approval from the HSD or the former Addictions & Mental Health Division (AMH), and receive public funds to provide treatment services are required to report to MOTS.

In addition to the general rule above, there are four basic ways to classify who is required to submit data to MOTS:

1. **Providers with HSD contracts that deliver treatment services.** This includes Community Mental Health Programs (CMHP), Local Mental Health Authorities (LMHA) and other types of community behavioral health providers. These programs should all have a license or letter of approval from HSD or AMH;
2. **Providers that are subcontractors.** This can be a subcontractor of a CMHP or other entity that holds a contract with HSD or the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), such as a Mental Health Organization (MHO), or a Coordinated Care Organization (CCO);
3. **Providers that HSD does not contract with but are required to submit data to MOTS by state/federal statute or rule.** These include DUII providers and methadone maintenance providers;
4. **Providers that contract with other governmental agencies** (e.g., the Oregon Youth Authority or the Department of Corrections) to deliver mental health and/or substance abuse services.

Note: Primary care physicians that provide a single service on behalf of the CMHP are not required to report the MOTS status or service level data.
