OHA and Grantees successfully signed and executed Grant Agreements for the Mobile Health Unit Pilot Program. Funds will be awarded, in full, to each Grantee.

What’s Next?

OHA will partner with and support each Grantee to onboard each Program. Program start dates vary across each Grantee, with timelines ranging from 12 to 18 months of service delivery from start date.

Legislative and Funding Updates

HB 2925 was passed in the 2023 Oregon Legislative Session and went into effect June 27, 2023. HB 2925 extends the timeline and staffing needs to accomplish the Legislative Reporting requirements of HB 4052.

HB 2918 did not pass in the 2023 Oregon Legislative Session. HB 2918 would provide the necessary \$4million in funds for the Mobile Health Pilot Program.

OHA currently awaits details of the approved agency budget to determine the availability of additional Mobile Health Unit Pilot Program funding.

Mobile Health Advisory Committee

On June 6, 2023, OHA invited the opportunity to meet with the Mobile Health Advisory Committee (MHAC). Committee members were invited to participate in an information session to learn more on the status of HB 4052, general Program updates, potential Program funding, and the future of the MHAC.

With the potential for future Mobile Health Unit Pilot Program funding, OHA expects the MHAC to continue.
