Notice of intent – OHA will amend the Medicaid State Plan to establish a payment model for integrated treatment of co-occurring disorders

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) will submit a State Plan Amendment to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to establish a single payment model for integrated treatment of co-occurring disorders: Addiction (substance use and gambling disorders) and mental health disorders, effective January 1, 2023. Under this model:

- Treatment programs that provide substance use disorder and/or mental health disorder treatment can apply for OHA approval to treat co-occurring disorders.
- OHA will pay participating programs at enhanced rates for approved services. Credentialed providers would receive a 10% increase over the fee-for-service fee schedule. Providers with a credential of master's level or above would receive a 20% increase. Residential providers would receive a 15% increase.

OHA estimates the annual aggregate cost in Federal Funds to be \$20,881,431.

Background:

Updating the State Plan would allow OHA to implement this payment model as directed by House Bill 2086 (2021).
