Notice of intent – OHA will amend the Medicaid State Plan to expand the Family Connects Oregon nurse home visiting program into Multnomah County.

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) will submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to expand the Family Connects Oregon nurse home visiting program into Multnomah County effective Jan. 1, 2026.

The program provides Targeted Case Management services to Medicaid-eligible infants from birth through 6 months of age. The Federal Fund estimate to provide this service in Multnomah County for 2026 is \$245,285.

Targeted Case Management
Family Connect® Nurse Home Visiting

Target Group:

Targeted case management (TCM) services will be provided to Medicaid eligible infants 0 through 6 months of age.

For case management services provided to individuals in medical institutions:

Target group comprised of individuals transitioning to a community setting and case management services will be made available for up to 180 consecutive days of the covered stay in the medical institution.

Areas of state in which services will be provided:

Entire State

Only in the following geographic areas (authority of section 1915(g)(1) of the Act is invoked to provide services less than Statewide)
Baker, Benton, Clatsop, Coos, Crook, Deschutes, Douglas, Gilliam, Hood River, Jefferson, Lane, Lincoln, Linn, Malheur, Marion, Multnomah, Polk, Sherman, Wasco, Washington, Wheeler and Yamhill County

Comparability of services:

Services are provided in accordance with section 1902(a)(10)(B) of the Act.

Services are not comparable in amount duration and scope.

1915(g)(1) of the Act is invoked to provide services without regard to the requirements of section 1902(a)(10)(B) of the Act.
