Subject: Oregon Health Plan covers travel and nonroutine adult vaccines starting Oct. 1, 2023

Starting Oct. 1, 2023, the Oregon Health Plan will cover the following codes. These are for nonroutine vaccines that the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommends for adults.

Code	Description
90473	Immunization administration by intranasal or oral route; 1 vaccine (single or combination vaccine/toxoid)
90474	Immunization administration by intranasal or oral route; each additional vaccine (single or combination vaccine/toxoid)
90581	Anthrax vaccine, for subcutaneous or intramuscular use
90584	Dengue vaccine, quadrivalent, live, 2 dose schedule, for subcutaneous use
90586	Bacillus Calmette-Guerin vaccine (BCG) for bladder cancer, live, for intravesical use
90587	Dengue vaccine, quadrivalent, live, 3 dose schedule, for subcutaneous use
90625	Cholera vaccine, live, adult dosage, 1 dose schedule, for oral use
90690	Typhoid vaccine, live, oral
90691	Typhoid vaccine, Vi capsular polysaccharide (ViCPs), for intramuscular use
90717	Yellow fever vaccine, live, for subcutaneous use
90738	Japanese encephalitis virus vaccine, inactivated, for intramuscular use
90758	Zaire ebolavirus vaccine, live, for intramuscular use

To reflect this change, Oregon Health Authority (OHA) will:

- List the specific codes in the Oct. 1, 2023 Prioritized List of Health Services, pending decisions at the August 17, 2023 meeting of the Health Evidence Review Commission. OHA expects to publish the list by Sept. 1, 2023, on the <u>Pending Prioritized List of Health Services page</u>.
- Update <u>Oregon Administrative Rule 410-120-1200</u> to remove language excluding travel vaccine coverage.

Why is this happening?

ACIP recommends these vaccines for adults due to underlying health conditions, occupation or travel. This change follows <u>federal guidance</u> to cover all ACIP-recommended vaccines for adults as required by section 11405 of the Inflation Reduction Act.

What should you do?

Please ensure coverage of these vaccines for your members by:

- Opening payment for the new vaccine codes.
- Assessing your provider network. Make changes if needed to ensure appropriate access to these services. Pay special attention to travel vaccine providers.

Please communicate this coverage change to:

- Providers who render or refer for these services.
- Members as appropriate. Update member-facing information to include this new coverage.
