

## **NCPDP Quantity Prescribed (460-ET) field required on point-of-sale claims for Schedule II medications beginning September 1, 2021**

Beginning September 1, 2021, the Oregon Health Authority (OHA)'s point of sale (POS) system will require fee-for-service claims for all Schedule II drugs to include the "Quantity Prescribed" field (460-ET).

- POS claims for Schedule II drugs will deny if this field is blank, contains all zeroes, or is missing.
- Denied claims will return a reject code of **ET - M/I Quantity Prescribed**.
- Overrides will **not** be available through the Oregon Pharmacy Call Center.

### **Why is this happening?**

Federal regulations at 45 CFR Part 162 require pharmacies to report this field for all Schedule II drugs, in order to identify Schedule II controlled substance claims that are partial or incremental fills versus prescription refills.

### **What should you do?**

Pharmacies should work with their software vendors to capture this mandatory field on all Schedule II drug claims by September 1, 2021.
