Notice of intent – OHA will amend the Medicaid State Plan to revise the effective date of its contract with Sweep Optical.

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) intends to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. The SPA will amend the Medicaid State Plan to revise the effective date for OHA's contract with Sweep Optical.

There is no estimated cost to make this change as it does not change reimbursement methods or add new services.

Background

Oregon law (ORS 279.850) requires public agencies like OHA to contract with Qualified Rehabilitation Facilities (QRFs) for products and services when available and suitable. The new effective date aligns with the new contract amendment for payments to Sweep Optical, the QRF that provides eyeglasses, contacts and hardware for fee-for-service Oregon Health Plan members.

METHODS AND STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING PAYMENT RATES

Except as otherwise noted in the plan, state-developed fee schedule rates are the same for both governmental and private providers for #12.d through #24.a below. Oregon conversion factors as listed on Attachment 4.19-B, page 1 of this state plan. All rates are published on the agency's website and can be accessed at <https://www.oregon.gov/oha/HSD/OHP/Pages/Fee-Schedule.aspx>

12.d. Eyeglasses, contacts and hardware

Payment for services is a state-wide fee schedule utilizing a contract with a ~~federally~~ qualified rehabilitation facility. The contract is amended periodically and is effective for service on or after ~~10/1/11~~ 7/1/25.

24.a. Transportation

Payment for Emergency Transport and Non-emergency transports not provided/arranged by the brokerage system is a state-wide fee schedule.

Client and necessary attendant reimbursement:

Mileage rate- 75% of IRS standard rate and is all-inclusive.

Meal rate- 50% of the IRS standard rate for Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner.

Lodging rate- 100% of the IRS standard rate

Volunteer drivers: Rides are reimbursed per standard GSA mileage rates for business miles driven.

The agency's fee schedule rate was set as of 4/1/23 and is effective for services provided on or after that date.
