Who qualifies for behavioral health care?

Citizenship Waived Medical (CWM) members can get emergency care and follow-up medication related to a behavioral health crisis. [Learn more about CWM benefits](#).

OHP members with OHP Plus or CWM Plus benefits can get non-emergency behavioral health care services.

How can OHP members get behavioral health services?
