What are behavioral health services?

Behavioral health services include:

- Outpatient services and residential programs to treat <u>substance</u> <u>use</u>, <u>problem gambling</u> and <u>mental health disorders</u>
- Applied behavior analysis
- Peer-delivered services
- Home and community-based services
- Services for children, young adults and their families

Who qualifies for behavioral health care?

Citizenship Waived Medical (CWM) members can get emergency care and follow-up medication related to a behavioral health crisis. <u>Learn more about</u> <u>CWM benefits</u>.

OHP members with OHP Plus or CWM Plus benefits can get non-emergency behavioral health care services.

How can OHP members get behavioral health services?

If you need help accessing behavioral health services, <u>contact your CCO</u>. Ask for care coordination.

If you are not in a CCO, contact <u>OHP Care Coordination</u> or <u>your local</u> <u>Community Mental Health Program</u>.
