Certificates of Creditable Coverage



What is a Certificate of Creditable Coverage?

A Certificate of Creditable Coverage shows an Oregon Health Plan (OHP) member's coverage dates for the last 24 months.

What is a Certificate of Creditable Coverage used for?

You may need this certificate to prove that you:

- Receive state assistance,
- No longer qualify for state assistance, or
- Have other health coverage.

You may need this kind of proof to:

- Defer student loan payments.
- Get help paying for children's events like summer camp.
- Opt out of employer-sponsored or school insurance.
- Document a "Qualifying Event" to be eligible for private health insurance coverage outside the plan's Open Enrollment period.
