

Information about weather-related supports for people on the Oregon Health Plan

Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members can apply for weather-related resources through a benefit called health-related social needs (HRSN) services Home Changes for Health during Extreme Weather.



#### What kinds of HRSN resources are available?

Eligible OHP members can get devices that help keep healthy temperatures and clean air, including air conditioners, heaters, air filtration devices and mini refrigeration units for medications. Devices like portable power supplies to operate medical equipment like ventilators for power outages caused by extreme weather events are also available.

#### Who qualifies for HRSN Home Changes for Health?

OHP members who have a health condition that makes extreme weather events challenging or dangerous, and who are in a life transition, such as

- Leaving incarceration (jail, detention, etc.)
- Leaving a mental health or substance use recovery facility
- In the Oregon child welfare system (foster care) now or in the past
- Going from Medicaid-only benefits to qualifying for Medicaid plus Medicare
- People who may becoming homeless
- Homeless
- Young adults with special healthcare needs (YSHCN)





# Home Changes for Health Benefits for OHP Members

#### How can OHP members apply for HRSN benefits?

CCO-enrolled OHP members should <u>contact their CCO</u> to learn more about the HRSN process. If an OHP member is not sure which CCO they are in, they can call the Client Services Unit, which can be reached by phone at 1-800-273-0557 or email: <u>Ask.OHP@odhsoha.oregon.gov</u>.

## Where else can OHP members find climate/weather related resources?

For OHP members not eligible for HRSN benefits, there may be other resources. OHP members enrolled in a CCO can apply to receive climate devices through flexible services programs. Flexible services are optional for CCOs and are subject to availability. OHP members should contact their CCO directly for more information.

OHP members on Open Card can check with their city or <u>county</u> to see if they have any programs available.
