**State of Oregon Standing Order to Provide Over-the-Counter (OTC)  
Oral Hormonal Contraception and Emergency Oral Hormonal Contraception  
to Oregon Health Plan (OHP) Members**

**Purpose:** This standing order permits an Oregon-licensed pharmacist to provide over-the-counter (OTC) oral hormonal contraception or emergency oral hormonal contraception to an eligible Oregon Health Plan (OHP) member, consistent with FDA approval, upon request, in Oregon.

Providing OTC medication under this standing order does not establish the Oregon Health Authority, its clinicians, or the pharmacist as the health care provider for the individual to whom the OTC medication is being provided. Individuals seeking more comprehensive reproductive health care should see a primary care provider.

**Eligible individuals:** An OHP member of childbearing potential who wants to prevent pregnancy.\*

\*Pregnancy prevention is the only FDA-approved indication for these medications at this time.

**Cost of medication and supplies:** OHP may be billed for the OTC oral hormonal contraceptive or emergency oral hormonal contraceptive.

**Expiration, Renewal and Review:** This standing order will expire on the date that the physician who signed the order revokes it or ceases to act as the physician licensed under ORS chapter 677 who is employed by the Oregon Health Authority, whichever comes sooner. This standing order shall be reviewed on a regular basis against current best practices and may be revised or updated if new information about OTC oral hormonal contraceptives or emergency oral hormonal contraceptives necessitates it.

**For individuals seeking OTC oral hormonal contraceptives or emergency oral hormonal contraceptives at a pharmacy:** The Oregon Health Authority suggests that you bring a digital or printed copy of this standing order with you to the pharmacy to share with the pharmacist.

**Authority:** This standing order is issued pursuant to the Oregon Health Authority's general public health authority and its authority as the state Medicaid agency. ORS 431.110, 431.144, 435.230, ORS 413.032.

**Purpose:** The purpose of this standing order is to eliminate barriers for Oregon Health Plan members in obtaining OTC oral hormonal contraceptives or emergency oral hormonal contraceptives.

**Authorization:** This standing order authorizes any eligible Oregon Health Plan member in the State of Oregon to receive OTC oral hormonal contraceptives or emergency oral hormonal contraceptives in a manner that enables OHP to be billed for the cost.

**Terms and Conditions:** Any pharmacist using this standing order to provide OTC oral hormonal contraceptives or emergency oral hormonal contraceptives to eligible persons, as defined above, should list the provider who signed this order as the prescriber. Pharmacists may, but are not required to, download the standing order and print it out so that the printed-out standing order functions like a written prescription. Pharmacists may fill in date of service and the recipient's name, date of birth, and medication allergies on the hard copy of the standing order. Additional elements, including the dose, quantity provided, directions for use, number of authorized refills, and physician's signature, are already provided in the standing order. The standing order functions analogously to an individual prescription written in the recipient's name.
