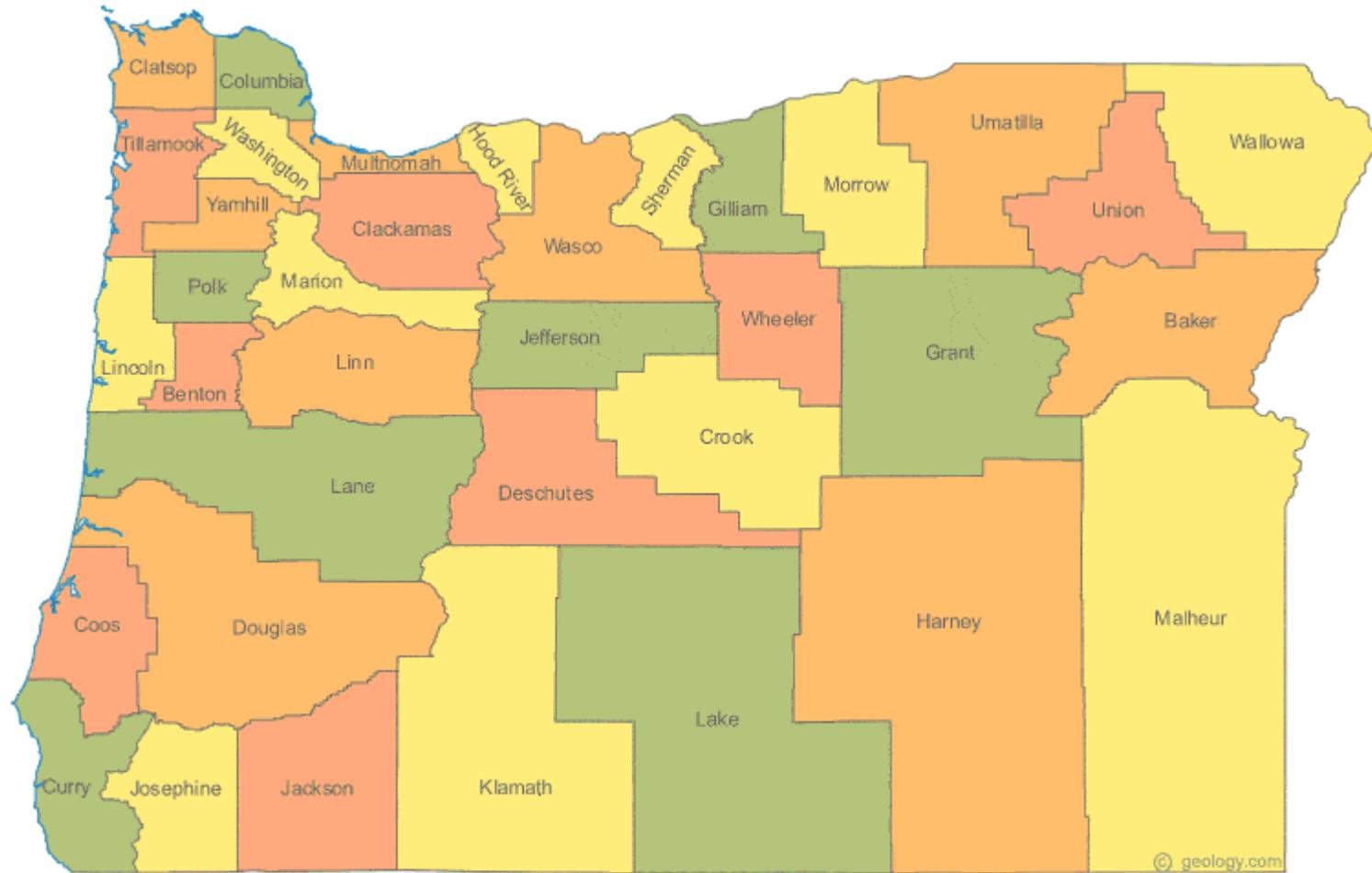

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SBHS Medicaid Program Overview



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Oregon SBHS Medicaid Program

- This is a cost-sharing program that allows reimbursement for eligible health-related services.
- OHA administers the program, including rules and regulations.
- ODE provides support to education agencies for efficient and sustainable billing.
- OHA and ODE partner to provide technical assistance and guidance for school districts and programs.

Opportunity in Oregon

Federal statutes require that school districts provide health services if needed by a student to access their free appropriate public education.

- School Medicaid billing can offset the costs incurred in providing these services.
- Medicaid reimbursement is flexible, and it may be used to fund additional health services staff, purchase health service supplies and assistive technology, fund specialized transportation and teaching materials, etc.

Setting Up Your Program

- **Enrollment:** Education agencies will need to have separate enrollments as School Medicaid providers — one for IDEA services and one for non-IDEA services.
- **Notification and Consent:** Education agencies need to provide written notification and obtain parent consent.
- **Individual Plan of Care (IPOC):** IEPs/IFSPs will meet this requirement, but IPOCs are needed for non-IDEA services.
- **Duplication of Services:** Clear processes and protocols are in place to avoid duplication of billing.
- **Cost Setting:** SBHS Medicaid cost setting is due January 31 each year.

Supports

- Oregon has seen an increase in the number of education agencies interested in billing. ODE and OHA continue to support school districts through:
 - Working to implement expanded billing as allowed by Oregon's updated State Plan Amendment (SPA)
 - Updating the SBHS Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs)
 - Determining what flexibilities the new federal guidance may offer
 - Providing technical assistance, training, and guidance
 - Developing and updating resources and guidance

Understanding the Individual Plan of Care (IPOC)

- What is an IPOC?
 - A prescriptive document required for billing Medicaid for school-based health services
 - A general term that may cover a variety of plans



Required Elements

- The effective dates of the IPOC
- The specific child or young adult's name
- The education agency's name
- Each necessary and appropriate health service category, including the nature, extent, or units of service and the therapeutic value for each service



Examples of IPOCs

If all required elements are met, the following plans may serve as an IPOC:

- Individualized Education Program (IEP)
- Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)
- Individualized Healthcare Plan (IHP)
- Any individualized health or behavioral health plan with the required prescriptive elements

504 Consideration

- If you are considering a 504 plan, creating a separate attachment including IPOC required elements, rather than updating the 504 plan, will be a best practice.

Case Example: Nursing Care Plan (1)

IPOC Required Elements

- The effective dates of the IPOC
- The specific child or young adult's name
- The education agency's name
- Each necessary and appropriate health service category, including the nature, extent, or units of service and the therapeutic value for each service

Nursing Care Plan for Diabetes Management in the School Setting

Student: Oliver Twist

8/15/2024 to 8/14/2025

Condition: Type I diabetes mellitus

Care Plan:

- School nurse will ensure Oliver checks his blood glucose levels 3 times per day, 5 days per week, while Oliver is in school.
- All protocols for . . . will be followed (protocols attached).
- [Other services as needed are documented here].

Qualified Education Agencies

Education agency definition:

Education agency means, for the purposes of these rules, a **public school district, EI/ECSE contractor or subcontractor, education service district, or state institution** providing educational services or transition services to children and young adults, birth through age 21, that receives state or federal funds either directly or by contract or subcontract with the Oregon Department of Education (ODE), that is also considered a local unit of government.

Education Agencies Eligible to Bill

New

- Education Service Districts (ESDs)
 - The district must consent to allow the ESD to bill on the district's behalf.
 - A process is needed to ensure there is not a duplication of service billing.
 - A contract or MOU should be executed to delineate the billing relationship.

Existing

- School Districts
- EI/ECSE Contractors
- State Institutions

IDEA and non-IDEA billing require separate enrollment as School Medicaid providers.



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SBHS Professional Learning and Supports



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CMS State Grant for School-Based Health Services

- Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has awarded OHA a \$2.5 million CMS State Grant for statewide implementation of Oregon School-Based Health Services, including training, technical assistance, and billing guidance to increase enrollment, claiming, reimbursement, and access for students.
- Grant period:
July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2027

Goals:

- Increase the number of education agencies enrolled and actively participating in SBHS from 59 to 80.
- Increase federal reimbursement and claiming by 25 percent for covered services provided to students with an IEP/IFSP and to general education students.
- Increase access to health care services for Medicaid- and CHIP-enrolled students.
- Decrease health and education disparities and improve outcomes for Oregon's children and young adults.

CMS State Grant Activities

- Expand state capacity to provide technical assistance (TA) and address infrastructure needs.
- **Develop and implement a training and TA plan that provides support to education agencies to address barriers, challenges, and infrastructure needs to successfully participate in Oregon's SBHS program.**
- Increase engagement with education agencies and partners.
- Implement strategies to generate input, evaluate the SBHS program, guide program improvements, and facilitate increased community engagement.
- Expand access to billing infrastructure for a pilot group of education agencies from 2025 to 2027.
