### Problem Gambling Prevention Biennial Implementation Plan Guidelines

These guidelines have been developed to inform and assist programs in the development of their 2019-2021 Problem Gambling Prevention Biennial Implementation Plans (BIP). The guidelines reflect the minimum requirements that must be included in the plan utilizing the OHA 2019-2021 PGS Prevention BIP document provided.

All plans must include the county or program name from the drop-down menu, vision statement, problem statement, and goal statement. Additional plan requirements:

Programs **that have completed** a community assessment:

- A minimum of two objectives with corresponding entries for activities, inputs, outputs, outcomes, CSAP strategies (when appropriate), and social ecology. Objectives must reflect the community assessment findings. To ensure programs are meeting the Service Element 80 language, one objective must be related to workforce development.


Programs **conducting a community assessment in 2019-2020 fiscal year:**

- A minimum of three objectives with corresponding entries for activities, inputs, outputs, outcomes, CSAP strategies (when appropriate), and social ecology. Three objectives should meet the following: 1) reflect the programs community assessment process and planning to update the BIP after completion of the community assessment; 2) ensure programs are meeting the Service Element 80 language for workforce development; and 3) be related to PG Prevention Education and awareness.

Strategic planning increases the effectiveness of prevention efforts by ensuring that prevention programs select and implement the most appropriate programs and strategies for their communities. An effective plan should reflect the input of key stakeholders, including community members. Collaborative planning processes are more likely to address community needs and be sustained over time.

The BIP is a “living document” and can be updated to reflect changes found necessary for the effective implementation of Problem Gambling Prevention Services at the community level.
