		Addressing the Increasing Prevalence of Unhealthy Alcohol & Opioid Use due to COVID-19	TA for Clinics - technical assistance related to SBIRT for unhealthy alcohol and drug use. Concerns about a rise in unhealthy alcohol and drug use concurrent with the physical distancing needed to suppress COVID-19 morbidity and mortality, amplifies the need for supportive efforts related to SBIRT and behavioral health integration. This collaborative project, ANTECEDENT, can provide primary care clinics with 12 months of tailored support to implement changes to address unhealthy alcohol use. Additionally, ORPRN is offering a complementary technical assistance opportunity regarding chronic pain management and opioid prescribing (aka PINPOINT).
