Background		
<p>For 2013-15, OHA proposed to create new elements of statewide technology infrastructure to support the coordinated care model, using an allocated portion of the Transformation fund (\$3m) to leverage 90/10 federal Medicaid funding. Known as “Phase 1.5”, this phase of HIT/HIE services builds a foundation for future statewide interoperability and HIE by supporting immediate coordination between providers seeking to exchange patient information and the incremental use of aggregated clinical data to improve the delivery of care. Phase 1.5 consists of six HIT/HIE foundational, high-priority initial services to support Oregon’s health system transformation, one of which is a state-level provider directory.</p> <p>The Statewide Provider Directory needs to be developed and implemented by 2015. A provider directory is a resource for provider information including demographics, addresses, affiliations to clinics, etc. Benefits of a state-level provider directory include:</p>		

- Support analytics used by OHA, health providers and systems, Coordinated Care Organizations (CCO), and health plans that rely on attributing providers to practice settings
- Enable the exchange of patient health information across different organizations and technologies by providing HIE addresses
- Provide efficiencies for OHA operations, oversight, and quality reporting
- Longer term, enhance care coordination across disparate providers and around transitions of care by providing easy access to provider information

The workgroup will provide regular reports to the Health Information Technology Advisory Group (HITAG) about progress on the provider directory. The HITAG serves as the governing body for the agreed upon Phase 1.5 services to support Oregon’s health system transformation efforts. RFP drafts will be provided to the HITAG for review and comment before the RFPs are released for bid. The RFP is expected to be released in spring or summer 2014. The OHA intends to have the provider directory services available in 2015.

Documentation produced from the meetings will be public documents.

Draft Parameters for Provider Directory

- ✓ Build incrementally to ensure success, but must have value right out of the gate
- ✓ Establish clear expectations regarding quality of provider information
- ✓ Contractor(s) both for implementation and operations
- ✓ Work in collaboration with Common Credentialing database/program (under development)
- ✓ Centralize where needed but allow for federation of existing provider directories

Workgroup Charge

The provider directory workgroup will be tasked with providing guidance on scope, functions and parameters of a state-level provider directory, which will inform the OHA’s scope of work for a Request for Proposal (RFP).
