


HB 4035 Dashboard Preview

Dashboard goals and requirements

When the public health emergency ends and the redetermination process begins, OHA and ODHS must produce a report that shows:

- Data on <u>enrollment</u>, <u>renewal</u> of enrollment and <u>disenrollment</u> in the medical assistance program;
- <u>Disaggregated data</u> on enrollment and disenrollment to assess the <u>disproportionate impact</u> on communities of color, persons with lower incomes and other populations that face disparities;
- Progress in processing the redeterminations.





CPWG Population Sequencing Recommendations

Phased Renewals by Population

When medical renewals begin, the state will be able to schedule the date of renewal by populations:

- Front-load easier cases (i.e., complete information, those most likely to keep their coverage) to process quickly once renewals begin
- Back-load higher risk cases to allow more time for outreach and longer coverage
- Community and Partner Workgroup provided recommendations on the sequence of each populations' renewal timing

Summary of Recommendations for Renewal Approaches to Maintain Access

Initiate the redetermination process for each person receiving medical assistance within 10 months

maintaining coverage while recognizing the needs of the workforce

to best support enrollments across insurance options
