



Need to Get Rid of Used Diabetic Supplies?

If you use insulin, you may use needles to inject your medication. This might leave you with a lot of used disposable needles and syringes.

When you're at home, you can use a sharps disposal container. These are special containers that prevent accidental punctures. The containers also ensure safe disposal. But what do you do when your sharps container is full?

There are several places you can take your sharps containers. These include drop boxes, supervised collection sites, and household hazardous waste collection sites. You can even look into mail-back programs.
