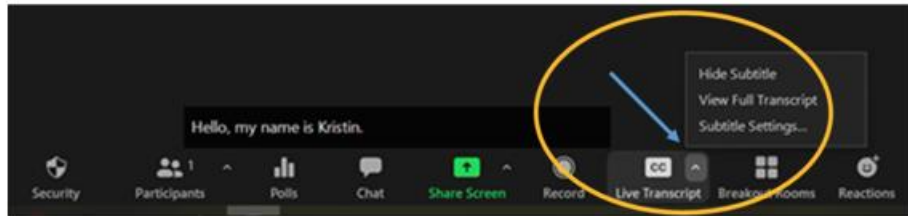

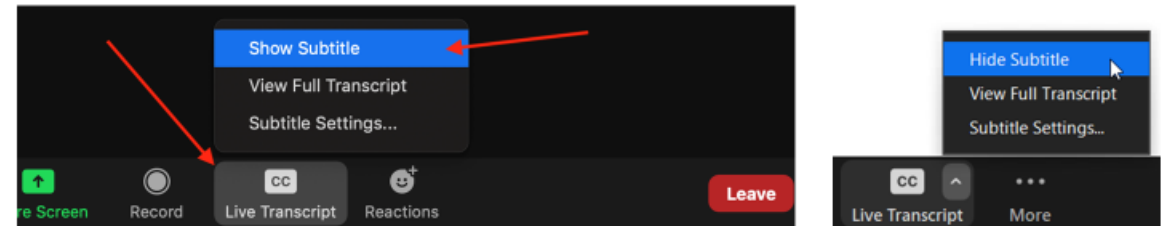

# Feedback Loop

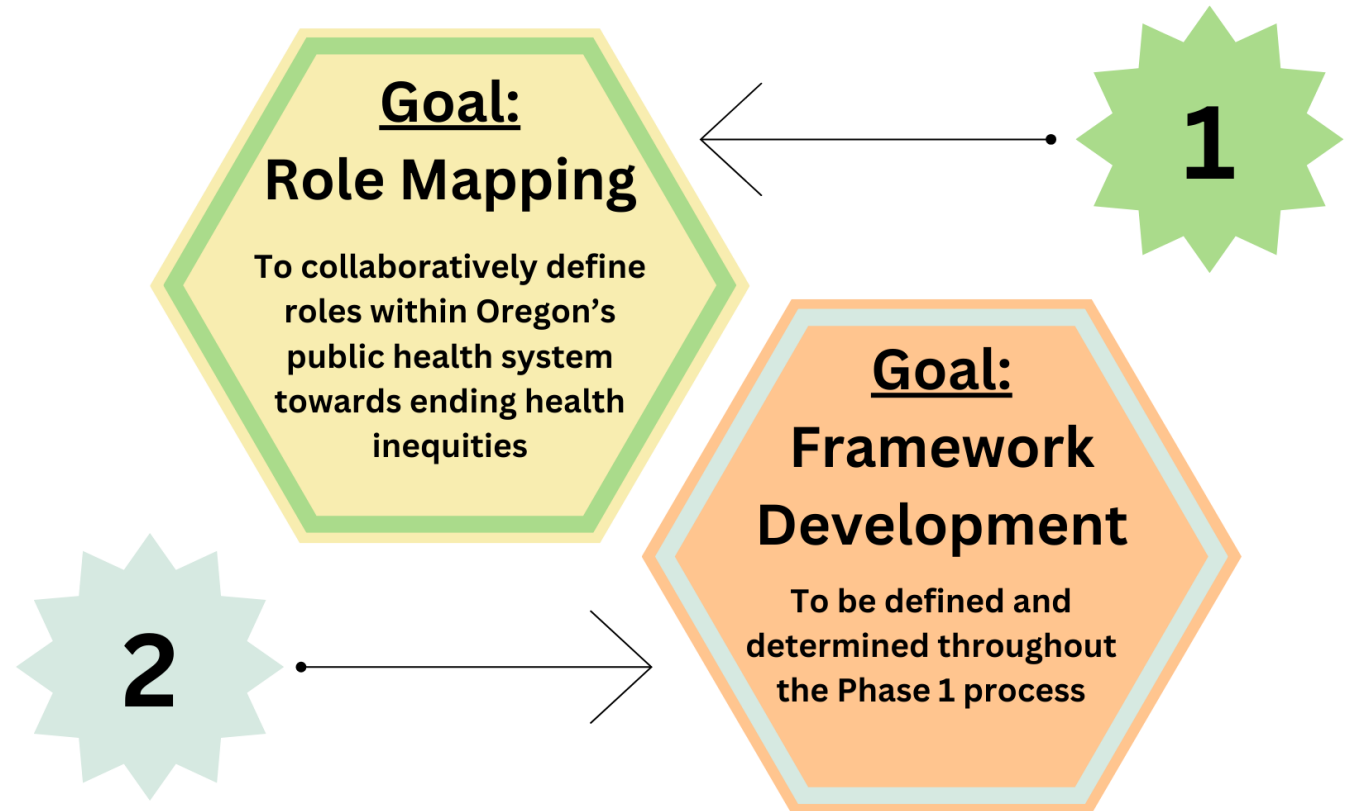
What was shared?	What was done?	Status/Follow Up

# Project Plan Phase 1

**HOW?**

## Collaborative development model:

Convening a workgroup with representation of key players  
from Oregon's public health system

Hosting bi-monthly workgroup meetings

Beginning with roles defined in Oregon's modernization  
manual

Centering power sharing and co-creation

Creating a role map with voices from community

# Deliverable descriptions: Role mapping (1)

- Defines the unique and complementary roles for ending health inequities:
  - **Oregon Health Authority**
  - **Local Public Health Authorities**
  - **Federally Recognized Tribes**
  - **Community Business Organizations**
  - **Other partners**
- Recognizes that all parts of the public health system are vital and need to work together to serve communities.

## Deliverable descriptions: Role mapping (2)

What does the document look like?

**VISION** for what the public health system can collectively achieve across the seven “domains” of public health practice

**ROLES** a table with roles for each part of the public health system

How will it be used?

- Informs funding decisions
- Encourages partnerships
- Brings attention to the ways that Oregon’s public health system serves communities



# Deliverable descriptions: Framework development (1)

- Provides a framework for decision-making to ensure that health equity and community health is at the center of decisions made across Oregon's public health system.
- While PHAB has a framework for equity-centered decision-making, this deliverable provides something that can be used for all public health system partners.

# Deliverable descriptions: Framework development (2)

What does the document look like?

- Still to be determined
- First step will be to identify an **existing framework**
- **Modify** it to meet Oregon's needs

How will it be used?

- OHA will use the framework to support decision-making and agency deliverables
- Public health system partners can use it for decision-making and agency deliverables

# Emergency Preparedness & Response

It involves planning ahead, training, and having resources in place to help keep people safe and minimize harm during emergencies.
