Oregon legislative session

Long session

- 160 days in odd-numbered years (2027, 2029, 2031)
- Two-year budget cycle is passed
- Can see thousands of bills introduced

Short session


- 35 days in even-numbered years (2026, 2028, 2030)
- Limited number of bills introduced

Legislative 2025 Schedule

** Bills must be voted on by a committee by this date

Jan 21	First day of session
Mar 21	First chamber posting deadline*
Apr 8	First chamber work session deadline**
May 9	Second chamber posting deadline*
May 23	Second chamber work session deadline**
June 29	Constitutional Sine Die (last day of session)
* Bills must be scheduled for a vote in committee by this date	

Reminder: How a Bill Becomes a Law



Legislative committees



Legislative Committees are where the majority of public policy work is done



Made up of small groups of legislators from both political parties



Committees are focused on specific topics



Committee members consider testimony from Oregon citizens during public hearings on a measure

Public Health Division Budget Requests

 POP 426, Ensuring High-Quality Care in Oregon Hospitals: \$999,997

POP 415, Domestic Well Safety: \$3.2M

 POP 427, Protecting Youth by Closing Tobacco Law Loopholes: \$8.4M savings to General Fund

Public Health Division Budget Requests

- POP 410, Public Health Modernization: \$2.0M
 - Makes investments to strengthen public health infrastructure
 - Builds on previous PHM investments totaling \$112M.

 - Written testimony must be submitted within 48 hours after the committee meeting starts
