




# Ordering Preadoption Birth Certificates by Mail or Drop Box



## To receive a certificate, you must:

-   Sign the completed form.
-   Include the payment for your order.
-   Include a copy of your current ID (words must be legible and photo must be clear).  
Tip: Take a photo of your ID and print it instead of using a copy machine.  
Visit [bit.ly/OR-Eligibility](https://bit.ly/OR-Eligibility) for a list of acceptable ID.
- Be eligible to receive the certificate and, if necessary, provide proof of eligibility.  
Only the adoptee may order their preadoption birth record.  
Adoptee must be born in Oregon.  
Adoptee must be 21 years of age or older.

All others wishing to order a preadoption certificate must obtain a court order from an Oregon court.

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## Helpful Hints for Completing the Preadoption Birth Certificate Order Form:

- If possible, type in the answers before printing the form. If completing by hand, print clearly.
- Indicate how many certificates you would like to order at the top of the form.
- Provide all names (first, middle and last) in their complete and legal form. Do not shorten the names or use initials unless they match what is on the record.  
(Example: Thomas Example Smith -NOT- Tom E. Smith)
- Note: Information provided should be of names on the record AFTER the adoption occurred.

 **Please do not staple any documents or checks to the order form.**

**Warning:** Providing false information is a felony under [ORS 432.993](#).

Only an adoptee age 21 or over is eligible to receive their preadoption birth certificate. All other persons may order only with a court order from an Oregon Court. ([ORS 432.380](#)).

**\$30 fee for the initial record search includes one certificate. Each additional copy is also \$30.**

The fee is non-refundable once the search for the record has been completed. ([Oregon Administrative Rule OAR 333-011-0340\(1\)](#)).

**Eligibility to Order:** By law, only the Adoptee age 21 and over may request a preadoption birth record. Other family members must obtain a court order from an Oregon court to open the adoption sealed file for the documents in it to be released.

**When ordering a preadoption birth record, applicants must provide proof of their identity and may need to provide additional documents to prove their eligibility.**

**Alternative identification you can send with your mail or drop box order:**

If you don't have a valid driver's license, ID card, or passport, send photocopies of three (3) different documents that include your name. At least one document must list your current address.

Suggested documents are listed below:

**Documents such as the following must have a current mailing address and can be no more than 30 days old:**

- Utility bill (for example, telephone, gas, electric, water, garbage removal) or other bill
- Insurance statement, medical statement, or paycheck stub

**Other documents such as the following may be used, but may not be expired:**

- Court or parole documents
- Valid work ID, unemployment statement, food stamp, or other benefit cards (copy both sides)
- Permit for firearms, fishing, hunting, or other license
- Vehicle registration, title, or insurance statement

**If you are the adoptee and you have no ID or other documents in your legal name after adoption, you will need to request your current legal birth record and obtain ID before placing an order for your preadoption birth record.** An immediate family member can help you order your current legal birth record. Immediate family members include a child's mother and the mother's parents, a child's father and the father's parents (if father is listed on the birth record), and the adult children of the person named on the birth record. The current legal birth record may also be requested by a legal representative of an immediate family member or a government agency representative.

**How long does it take to receive a copy of this form when ordered by mail or drop box?**

Processing times vary depending on workload. See the "Order a Certificate" menu at [www.HealthOregon.org/chs](http://www.HealthOregon.org/chs) or call 971-673-1190 for the latest processing times. Times that are posted are for orders that do not have any issues. The following scenarios may also cause further delays: 1) Missing payment 2) Missing ID 3) Missing eligibility documents 4) Inaccurate or incomplete order form information 5) The record is not on file. **Note:** Processing time includes ordering files stored off-site, and sometimes ordering more than one file to locate the first birth record filed.

If something additional is needed from you, we will reach out to you by mail or secure email.

Orders for a preadoption birth record must be completed by mail or drop box. There is no option to order this certificate on the web or by telephone. We also do not recommend that this record be ordered in person as it cannot be immediately produced from the system and needs to be mailed to the applicant after the order has been received.
