### Summary of Oregon vital events, 2013

<b>Population</b>	3,919,020	The population increased 35,285, or 0.9%, since 2012.
<b>Deaths</b>	<b>Residents</b>	
Number	33,931	The number of deaths increased by 1456.
Rate	8.7	The rate increased by 3.6%.
<b>Infant deaths</b>	<b>Residents</b>	
Number	225	The number of infant death decreased by 14.
Rate	5.0	The rate decreased by 5.7%.
<b>Neonatal deaths</b>	<b>Residents</b>	
Number	156	The number of neonatal deaths decreased by 7.
Rate	3.5	The rate decreased by 2.8%.
<b>Maternal deaths</b>	<b>Residents</b>	
Number	12	Oregon's average maternal death rate for 2009–13 was 17.5.
Rate	26.6	Oregon's average maternal death rate for 2008–12 (14.2) was 35.9% lower than the average U.S. rate <sup>1</sup> for 2008–12 (22.2).

NOTE: Crude death rates are per 1,000 population; infant and neonatal rates per 1,000 live resident births; maternal death rates per 100,000 live resident births. In 2006, the method of calculating maternal death changed to include a longer time frame after the birth.
