

Estimated medical treatment costs of chronic diseases, Oregon 2010



Introduction: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has provided the Chronic Disease Cost Calculator (version 2) to states to estimate medical costs of treatment for chronic diseases. Oregon estimates from this calculator for 2010 are below.
