Ballot Measure 44
Passes

Oregonians pass Ballot Measure 44, raising the cigarette tax 44 cents and appropriating 3 cents to establish the statewide tobacco prevention and education program.

2005 Creation of 20 foot Rule

The City of Prineville and Crook County implement ordinances prohibiting smoking within 20 feet of publicly owned buildings.





2006 Tobacco Free Hospital Policy

Pioneer Memorial Hospital enacts a tobacco free campus policy.
