Background

History of Oregon's ICAA

1998-2001: 12 Oregon communities pass smoke-free workplace laws

2001: Statewide











2007: Expansion



2011: Smoke shops



2015: Inhalant delivery systems

Oregon Retail Cannabis Timeline

1998

Measure 67 establishes Oregon Medical Marijuana Act

2014

Measure 91 legalizes marijuana for recreational use

October 1, 2015

Limited retail sales of marijuana through dispensaries

July 2016

Launch Stay True to You, Youth Prevention media campaign

December 31, 2016

Retail marijuana sales in medical marijuana dispensaries ends

2013

HB 3460 allows medical marijuana dispensaries and establishes registry

August 2015

HB 3400 allows local control of marijuana sales

SB 460 allows early sales of non-medical marijuana through dispensaries

June 2016

Limited retail sales plus (included edibles)

October 2016


Begin retail marijuana store licensing

Current cannabis use among Oregon adults


Cannabis use has increased 50% among adults since 2014

Current cannabis use among Oregon adults by age


Cannabis use has increased among all age groups since 2014


Current cannabis use among Oregon youth

Cannabis use has remained fairly stable over time in Oregon and nationally



Access and harm perceptions among Oregon youth


More Oregon youth think that cannabis is easy to get, and fewer perceive cannabis use as harmful

Method of cannabis use among youth and adults

The vast majority of youth and adult current cannabis users reported smoking it



Co-use of other substances is common

Adults and youth who use currently use cannabis are also more likely to consume alcohol, smoke cigarettes, and use e-cigarettes

Among **youth** who use cannabis:

63% also use alcohol

30% also smoke cigarettes

45% also use e-cigarettes

Among adults who use cannabis:

77% also use alcohol

38% also smoke cigarettes

Attitudes and perceptions among Oregon adults

The majority of Oregonians support the ICAA

87%

of Oregon adults support the ICAA, which includes e-cigarettes and cannabis smoke and vapor

79%

of Oregon adults believe that people should be **protected** from breathing secondhand cannabis smoke or vapor

77%

of Oregon adults believe that all businesses should be smoke and vape free indoors



(Inter)national Landscape




States that have legalized <u>retail</u> cannabis sales:

- Colorado
- Oregon
- Alaska
- Washington
- Nevada
- California
- Massachusetts
- Maine





All states (and Canada) are discussing public use of cannabis



Precedent for public use of cannabis

California has weakened its indoor clean air law to allow for public use of cannabis.

Now is the time to bring the public health perspective and ensure the ICAA remains strong.





What could public use of cannabis in Oregon look like?



Allowing cannabis use indoors at licensed:

- Restaurants, cafes, bars
- Smoke shops
- Private clubs
- Retail stores
- Medical dispensaries
- Temporary events
- Jurisdictions where retail cannabis is prohibited





Redefinition of public place (ORS Chapter 475B)

- Sidewalks, streets, parks, etc.
- Allowing cannabis use wherever tobacco use is allowed





Allowing outdoor public use of cannabis at licensed:

- Patios
- Designated spaces
- Temporary events
- Jurisdictions where retail cannabis is prohibited





What can we do?



What can we do?

- 1. Restate ICAA laws (locally)
- 2. Expand the ICAA (close exemptions)
- Ban public consumption at temporary events or permanent outdoor spaces
