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Challenging Environments

Examples of challenging environments:

- Decision maker opposition to tobacco free policy
- Powerful opponent
- Organization or key-players inexperienced or ineffective in policy change
 - Overall organizational resistance to policy change

DEALING WITH CHALLENGING ENVIRONMENTS

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Unexpected Deterrents

Examples of unexpected deterrents:

- Decision maker flip-flop
- Previously "undetected" powerful opponent
- "Unrelated" agency crisis that negatively affects
 TFI
- Leadership turnover/organizational disarray
- Spurious (well-intentioned) alternate proposal

DEALING WITH UNEXPECTED DETERRENTS

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Monitoring Policy Implementation

- Establish a system/structure to observe compliance/non-compliance
- Pay attention to and document employee comments
 - Respond to all comments/concerns in thoughtful, empathetic, and timely manner



 Look for themes such as areas of confusion/concern that may need to be addressed in broader communication or policy adjustments

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Evaluating Policy Implementation & Impact

- Pre and post-implementation employee surveys
- Tracking complaints about violations
- Observational assessments of the campus
- Uptick in employees accessing cessation benefits, getting meds, quitting, etc.
