


In the Beginning • Prior to 1984, Boeing Portland allowed the use of tobacco anywhere and had cigarettes vending machines around the site. • In 1984, the cigarette vending machines were eliminated.



Getting a little more serious

 In the Late 80's and early 90's, smoking was prohibited in the offices and restrooms. But you could still smoke in the factory





The Journey Ends

 In Oct 2008, the site went tobacco free. The smoke shacks were torn down and are now used for bicycle parking. This was a culmination of a year long effort to provide awareness and support for our employees.



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
Preparing for a Tobacco Free Workplace

- Site committee comprised of Senior leadership, union representative, security, facilities, human resources, communications, and project management.
 - Provided a tobacco cessation fair
 - Health and safety fair
 - Promotion of smoking cessation program benefit called Quit for Life
- The company provided periodic communications for 10 months prior to the implementation date.



Quit For Life Program[™]

- The Boeing Company participation since 2002 has been over 14,000 employees
- At Boeing Portland, in 2008 alone 62 people participated in the Quit4Life program
- Based on the program's quit rate of 40%, estimated that 25 employees quit tobacco using this benefit the year the company implemented a tobacco free policy.
- We would hope that people quit using other means too, or have cut back as a result of the new policy.



Personal Employee Story

Boeing shares employee success stories in newsletter communications periodically. This is one example.....

- Smoked one pack a day for 35 years
- Looking toward Retirement
 - Quit for his health so he could enjoy his retirement years
 Monetary Reason: \$600/ month, \$7200/ year on cigarettes and over a 10 year period= \$70,000+

Since quitting....

He walks 5 miles a day, has lost weight, eating healthier and of course, feels like he's in his 30's again.
