

## Caregivers

A caregiver must be 18 years or older and one individual may be designated by multiple patients. There are 4,740 caregivers designated by 4,814 patients.

## Organizational Caregivers

An organizational caregiver is an organization that provides hospice, palliative or home health care services, or a residential facility, that has significant responsibility for managing the well-being of a patient and is designated as an additional caregiver under ORS 475C.791.

There is one organizational caregiver designated by three patients.

## Growers

A grower must be 21 years or older and one individual may grow for a maximum of eight patients at a time. A patient may designate themselves or another person as their grower. There are 2,522 growers designated by 3,055 patients.

## Grow Sites where Patient is Own Grower or Designated Another Person as their Grower

A patient may designate themselves as their own grower or designate another person to grow for them as their designated grower. More than one grower may be growing at a grow site.

## Grower Reporting Requirements

OMMP growers are required to report into one of two reporting systems unless they are exempt from reporting. A grower may be required to either report monthly using the OMMP's Oregon Medical Marijuana Online System (OMMOS) or in real time using the Oregon Liquor Control Commission's Cannabis Tracking System (CTS).

The criteria to determine which system a grower is required to use for reporting is as follows:

**CTS:** Reporting required if the grow site has three or more registered patients.

**OMMOS:** Reporting required if the grow site has one or two patients, and one or more of the following is true:

- A grower is designated to grow for an OMMP patient (named patient and grower are different).
- A patient, who is named as their own grower, at a grow site address that is NOT their residence.
- A patient, who is named as their own grower, at a grow site address that is their residence and is transferring marijuana items to a medical processor or dispensary.

**Exempt:** A grower at a grow site with one or two patients is exempt from reporting if ALL of the following are true:

- A patient, who is named as their own grower, at a grow site address that is their residence; and
- The patient, who is named as their own grower, is not transferring marijuana items to a medical dispensary or processing site.

A grow site with two patients may have a grower required to report into OMMOS, and a second grower EXEMPT from reporting. In the data set below, this type of grow site is represented in the OMMOS reporting system.

## Attending Provider Types by Patient Applications

On January 5, 2026, there were **1,322** attending providers associated with patient applications.

Attending providers may be licensed as a MD, DO, PA, NP/NI, CNS, CRNA or ND<sup>3</sup>.

789 Patients provided applications with proof that they are exempt from submitting medical documentation under ORS 475C.783(11)(b)<sup>4</sup> (100% disabled US Veteran exemption) accounting for 6.5% of patient applications.

## Attending Providers with 450 or More Patient Applications

Attending providers associated with 450 or more patients at one time must provide additional documentation showing the patient's medical records have been reviewed, and an examination and planned follow-up care was provided.<sup>5</sup>

“There are 1,314 attending providers currently associated with between one and 449 patient applications, accounting for 46.1% (5,617) of applications. There are 8 attending providers currently associated with 450 or more patient applications, accounting for 47.4% (5,769) of applications. The remaining 6.5% (789) applicants were exempt<sup>4</sup>”



<sup>1</sup> Participant counts are based on distinct combinations of person, role (patient, caregiver, grower) and mailing address county. If one person is the caregiver for three patients and has a mailing county of Multnomah on all three patient applications, that person would be counted once as a caregiver in Multnomah County. If one person is a caregiver for three patients and has Multnomah as a mailing address on one patient application and Clackamas on the other two patient applications, that person would be counted once as a caregiver in Multnomah County, and once as a caregiver in Clackamas County.

Grow site address counts are based on distinct addresses. If one address is designated as the grow site for three patients, it will be counted once.

<sup>2</sup> Conditions are not mutually exclusive; one patient may report one or more conditions.

<sup>3</sup> The definition of “attending provider” expanded effective 01/01/2022 to include the attending provider types below. See ORS 475C.777(1).

MD or DO - physician licensed under ORS chapter 677;

PA - physician assistant licensed under ORS 677.505 to 677.525;

NP/NI - nurse practitioner licensed under ORS 678.375 to 678.390;

CNS - clinical nurse specialist licensed under ORS 678.370 and 678.372;

CRNA - certified registered nurse anesthetist as defined in ORS 678.245; or

ND - naturopathic physician licensed under ORS chapter 685.

<sup>4</sup> Renewing patients are not required to submit medical documentation if they are a veteran who has been assigned a total and permanent disability rating as a result of service-connected disabilities; or has a US VA total disability rating of 100%. See ORS 475C.783(11)(b).

<sup>5</sup> Attending providers associated with 450 or more patients must provide documentation that the patient’s medical records have been reviewed, and an examination and follow up care was provided, or an exemption. See OAR 333-008-0700(4).

<sup>6</sup> OMMP application fee types and current amounts are as follows:

- “No Reduced Fee”: No reduced fee proof is submitted with the application. Fee is **\$200**.
- “SNAP”: Oregon Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program recipient. Fee is **\$60**.
- “OHP”: Oregon Health Plan recipient. Fee is **\$50**.
- “SSI”: Supplemental Security Income recipient. Fee is **\$20**.
- “VET”: Proof of having served in the US armed forces. Fee is **\$20**.
- “VET Fee Waived”: Proof of having a US VA total rating disability of at least 50% from an injury or illness incurred or aggravated during active military service and who received a discharge or release under other than dishonorable conditions. Fee is **\$0**. Effective 01/01/22

<sup>8</sup> Count includes applications received with payment; not all received applications are approved.
