MEDICAL MARIJUANA INFORMATION BULLETIN 2021-04

Subject: Temporary Rules for Registrants Effected by Oregon Wildfires Set to Expire on April 19, 2021

The Oregon Medical Marijuana Program (OMMP) adopted temporary rules to assist those that were affected by the Oregon Wildfires that occurred in 2020. Those temporary rules are set to expire on April 19, 2021.

If you are a currently registered OMMP patient, caregiver or grower and had your OMMP card lost or damaged due to the wildfire in Oregon, you may request a replacement card for no fee. To request a replacement card, submit a written request by mail or email and include your name, date of birth, mailing address, which card is needing to be replaced and a brief statement on how you were affected. OMMP contact information is at the bottom of this bulletin. **To qualify for a replacement card for no fee your request must be postmarked no later than April 19, 2021.**

Patients: It is important that you contact OMMP if any changes to your registration are needed due to the wildfires in Oregon. If you need to change your caregiver, grower, or grow site, please submit a change form and indicate on the form the change is needed due to the Oregon wildfires and the replacement card fee will be waived. If you are changing grow site locations, consent forms from the property owner are still required.
