

**2021 Legislation introduced to date relating to marijuana or cannabis.**

**Senate and House bills including sponsors, summaries, and committee assignment.**

**Senate Bills:**

SB 96 At the request of Governor Kate Brown for Oregon Liquor Control Commission  
Currently assigned to the Senate Committee on Healthcare

Defines “cannabinoids” for purpose of inhalant delivery systems. Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to consult with Oregon Liquor Control Commission on adoption of rules related to inhalant delivery systems containing cannabinoids. Authorizes commission to regulate testing and labeling of inhalant delivery systems that contain cannabinoids derived from industrial hemp. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

157 At the request of Senate Interim Committee on Finance and Revenue  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Enacts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary caregiver from tax imposed on retail sale of marijuana items. Applies to retail sales of marijuana items occurring on or after January 1, 2016, and before January 1, 2028.

307 Sponsored by: Sen. Riley  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Waives fees for obtaining medical marijuana card for veterans who have total disability rating of at least 50 percent as result of injury or illness incurred or aggravated during active military service, and who received discharge or release under other than dishonorable conditions.

400 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to study medical marijuana registry identification cardholders. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary. Sunsets January 2, 2022.  
Declares emergency, effective on passage

408 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Oregon Retailers of Cannabis Association, Cannabis Association and F.A.R.M.S. Inc.) (Pre-session filed)  
Currently assigned to House Committee on Labor and Business

Allows marijuana producer to track by batch mature marijuana plants. Defines “batch.” Allows marijuana producers owned at least 51 percent by same person to transfer to one another marijuana and usable marijuana. Allows marijuana producer to receive specified marijuana items from marijuana processor. Specifies information required in transfer manifest for transport of marijuana.

411 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to the Senate Committee on Healthcare

Directs Oregon Health Authority and Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study cannabis packaging. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to environment. Sunsets January 2, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5533 At the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services  
Currently assigned to Joint Ways and Means.

Maintains and reserves lottery revenues available to benefit public purposes during biennium beginning July 1, 2021, in Administrative Services Economic Development Fund. Allocates moneys from fund for biennium beginning July 1, 2021. Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish process for quarterly allocations of moneys from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund and Veterans' Services Fund. Transfers certain interest earnings from Oregon Education Fund to Lottery Bond Fund for payments by Department of Education, on education lottery bonds. Allocates moneys from Veterans' Services Fund for biennium beginning July 1, 2021. Directs distribution of moneys from Criminal Fine Account. Directs distribution of moneys from Oregon Marijuana Account. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2021.

**House Bills:**

2014 Sponsored by Representative OWENS (at the request of City of Ontario) (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to the House Committee on Revenue

Provides for distribution of moneys in Oregon Marijuana Account to certain cities determined by population and location of city and based on share of retail sales of marijuana items in state, as exception to standard distributions based on city share of population and of licenses for marijuana related businesses. Applies to distributions from account occurring in calendar quarters beginning on or after January 1, 2022, and before July 1, 2027. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die. Maintains and reserves lottery revenues available to benefit public purposes during biennium beginning July 1, 2021, in Administrative Services Economic Development Fund. Allocates moneys from fund for biennium beginning July 1, 2021. Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish process for quarterly allocations of moneys from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund and Veterans' Services Fund. Transfers certain interest earnings from Oregon Education Fund to Lottery Bond Fund for payments by Department of Education, on education lottery bonds. Allocates moneys from Veterans' Services Fund for biennium beginning July 1, 2021. Directs distribution of moneys from Criminal Fine Account. Directs distribution of moneys from Oregon Marijuana Account. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2021.

2015 Sponsored by Representative OWENS (at the request of City of Ontario) (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to the House Committee on Revenue

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Increases maximum percentage of tax that governing body of city or county may impose on sale of marijuana items. Applies to marijuana items sold on or after January 1, 2022. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

2111 At the request of Governor Kate Brown for Oregon Liquor Control Commission  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Changes name of "Oregon Liquor Control Commission" to "Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission."  
Declares emergency, effective August 2, 2021. Changes name of "Oregon Liquor Control Commission" to "Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission." Declares emergency, effective August 2, 2021

2263 Sponsored by Representative LIVELY (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study recreational marijuana tracking. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to economic development. Sunsets January 2, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage

2265 Sponsored by Representative LIVELY (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study cannabis. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to economic development. Sunsets January 2, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2294 Sponsored by Representative MORGAN (Pre-session filed.)

Imposes tax on wholesale sales of marijuana items across county borders. Applies to wholesale sales of marijuana items occurring on or after January 1, 2022. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die

2416 Sponsored by Representative HELM; Senator PROZANSKI (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Directs State Department of Agriculture to advance design of cannabis business certification program. Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to allocate moneys from Marijuana Control and Regulation Fund to department for purposes of cannabis business certification program. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

2445 Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON (Pre-session filed)  
Currently assigned to the House Committee on Revenue

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Enacts express sunset for exemption of medical marijuana registry cardholder or primary caregiver from tax imposed on retail sale of marijuana items. Applies to retail sales of marijuana items occurring on or after January 1, 2016, and before January 1, 2028.

2519 Sponsored by Representative MORGAN (Pre-session filed.)  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

Allows delivery of marijuana items, pursuant to bona fide orders, to consumers within city or county in which marijuana retailer is located and to consumers in cities or counties that have adopted ordinances allowing for delivery of marijuana items from adjacent cities or counties

2806 Sponsored by Representative SMITH DB; Representative LEIF (Pre-session)  
Currently assigned to the House Committee on Business and Labor

Prohibits person that transacts title insurance in this state from refusing to issue policy of title insurance or refusing to close or insure real property transaction solely because real property that is subject of transaction has been used for purpose of growing, producing, manufacturing or selling cannabis, or conducting other activities related to cannabis, if growing, production, manufacture, sale or other activities occurred in compliance with state laws relating to regulation of marijuana items. Provides that violation of provisions of Act is unfair and deceptive practice in transaction of insurance. Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules to prohibit violation and to provide for imposing civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 for violation. Becomes operative on January 1, 2022. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

2973 Sponsored by Representative NOSSE  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY Prohibits person 21 years of age or older from possessing more than two ounces of usable marijuana in public place. Provides that delivery of not more than two ounces of usable marijuana to person 21 years of age or older is exempt from certain laws regulating marijuana. Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to adopt rules in accordance with possession limits. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Currently in House Committee on General Government.

2982 Sponsored by Representative HELM  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY Prohibits Oregon Liquor Control Commission from disciplining licensee or licensee representative for violation if violation is result of theft.

2990 Sponsored by Representative MORGAN  
Currently assigned to House Committee on Healthcare

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SUMMARY Requires Oregon Health Authority to share specified information related to marijuana for medical use with authorized employees of local governments for certain purposes.

2996 Sponsored by Representative WILDE –  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to establish by rule process to register medical marijuana grow sites. Defines “medical marijuana grow site.” Allows medical marijuana grow sites to apply for registration no later than June 1, 2022. Establishes plant production limits for medical marijuana grow sites registered by commission. Specifies that marijuana grow sites registered by Oregon Health Authority may produce marijuana for no more than two registry identification cardholders. Becomes operative January 1, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2997 Sponsored by Representative WILDE  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY Directs Department of Revenue, Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Liquor Control Commission, State Department of Agriculture and Governor’s office to consult with Oregon Cannabis Commission and other cannabis entities to develop plan to address issues related to regulatory authority over marijuana. Requires plan to be submitted to interim committees of Legislative Assembly. Sunsets January 2, 2022. Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to adopt rules to develop compliance education programs for cannabis entities regulated by commission. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

3000 Sponsored by Representative WILDE  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study cannabis. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary. Sunsets January 2, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

3013 Sponsored by Representative WILDE  
Currently assigned to House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study regulation of cannabis. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to economic development. Sunsets January 2, 2022. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5024 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for certain biennial expenses. Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,

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tobacco and marijuana tax receipts, beer and wine tax receipts, provider taxes and Medicare receipts, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by authority for certain purposes. Limits biennial expenditures by authority from certain lottery moneys for certain purposes. Limits biennial expenditures by authority from certain federal funds for certain purposes. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures. Limits biennial expenditures from Public Employees' Revolving Fund and Oregon Educators Revolving Fund for benefit plan premiums and self-insurance. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2021.
