

# OREGON PUBLIC HEALTH DIVISION REPORTING FOR HEALTHCARE ACQUIRED INFECTIONS (HAIs)

House Bill 2524 established a mandatory Healthcare Acquired Infection (HAI) Reporting Program. The program was created to raise awareness of HAIs, to promote a transparent means of informing consumers, to aid healthcare facilities in preventing HAIs ([healthoregon.org/hai](http://healthoregon.org/hai)). The following table compares the Oregon HAI reporting requirements with those of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

## ADDITIONAL MANDATORY REPORTING

### Communication of Multidrug-Resistant Organisms

**during Patient Transfer:** When a referring facility transfers or discharges a patient who is infected or colonized with a multidrug-resistant organism (MDRO) or pathogen that warrants Transmission Based Precautions, it must include written notification of the infection or colonization to the receiving facility.<sup>7</sup>

**Mandatory reporting:** Healthcare facilities and providers are required to report outbreaks of HAIs, including common source outbreaks and single case MDROs of public health significance.<sup>8</sup> MDROs reportable at one case are shown with an asterisk (\*) to the right.

**Multidrug-Resistant Organism (MDRO):** An organism that causes human disease which has acquired antibiotic resistance, as listed and defined in the *Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Antibiotic Resistance Threats in the United States, 2019*. MDROs include but are not limited to:

- Candida auris*\*
- Carbapenem-resistant *Acinetobacter* (CRA)\*
- Carbapenem-resistant *Enterobacteriales* (CRE)\*
- Carbapenemase-producing organism (CPOs)\*
- Toxin-producing *Clostridioides difficile*
- Vancomycin-resistant *Enterococcus* (VRE)
- Carbapenem-resistant *Pseudomonas aeruginosa* (CRPA)
- Methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA)
- Drug-resistant *Streptococcus pneumoniae*
- Other Gram-negative bacteria producing extended-spectrum beta-lactamases (ESBLs)

## FOOTNOTES

- Long-term acute care hospitals are licensed as acute care hospitals in Oregon and therefore are subject to the same reporting requirements as hospitals.
- CMS HAI reporting requirements are for prospective Payment System facilities, not critical access hospitals or children's hospitals. <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/cms/index.html>.
