2.	Overall Orpheus Update – Stephen/June - Server update - we're still in the process of trying to procure a physical server; Orpheus currently on a virtual machine. Initial analyses show a median of about 43 disconnects/day. - Security Audits are going to your Overall Responsible Parties - We still need to hear back from about 13 ORPs. The two main areas of focus for this year's audit are: - 1. Defining the export location -- the best practice is to export data to a secure location, i.e., a secured network location. The audit will

	cover from 1/1/2012 through early March 2014. - 2. Documenting jurisdiction-specific security training, e.g. HIPAA, the user had in this time period. Q: Is there a data use agreement? Yes. The policy itself acts as a data use agreement. June demonstrated how to navigate to a secure drive via Citrix: Training – June. Upcoming training and webinars are set up for the 1st Wednesday's of the month from 10:30 to 11:30. A few spots are still open for a Thursday morning (3-20-2014) in-person training in Eugene. Orpheus, Outbreaks, GI Case Log, and Napoli (for point source outbreaks) also will be reviewed by Hillary Booth.	
3.	ELR - June (for Michelle) - Peacehealth is still running parallel - please let Michelle know if you'd like them to turn off the fax. Sidney from Lane would like them to turn off the fax. Julie from the state would like them to continue faxing. Please let Michelle know whenever you get a fax and don't get and ELR of the same faxed lab report. It could be that a certain code isn't triggering the ELR.	
4.	Nontuberculous <i>Mycobacterium</i> – (NTM). Maureen will be reviewing the investigative guideline for NTM, which was originally put in the TB group, but it's now in the Misc CD group. Q: Are counties going to be getting smear positive and AFB ELRs from Peacehealth once they quit faxing? Presumably. Lindsey will

see if Peacehealth is sending them, as they are not necessarily reportable on their own. If they are coming through, Lindsey will make sure they're reportable.

The only NTM ELRs coming though are supposed to be non-respiratory by definition.

June showed the lab result interface for working up an NTM. Counties to let Maureen know if the interface is not coming through. Investigative Guideline will be discussed at CLHO CD tomorrow.

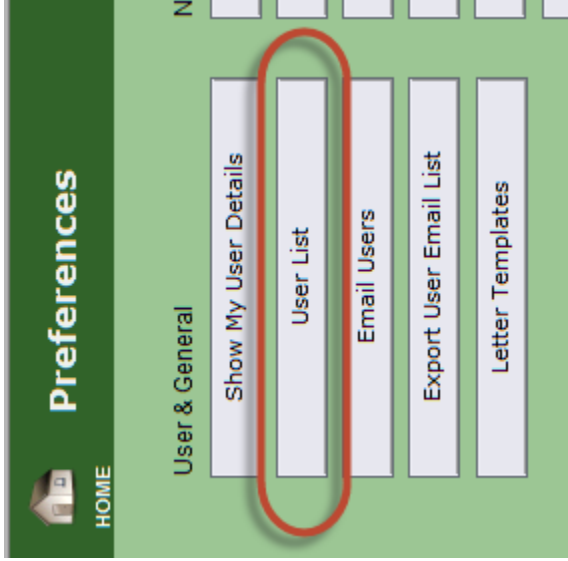

5.	STD update - Ruth Hensley, Patrick Gordan, and Sean Schafer have divided up Doug Harger's previous STD-related work. Ruth is doing the programmatic work, and Patrick is doing a lot of the technical work. The best number to reach Patrick is 971-673-0168. Patrick.Gordon@state.or.us. We currently have 3 statewide disease investigation specialists, and we'll be adding an STD epi soon. Q: What is the best way to follow up on Syphilis Labs? Send a note or assignment via Orpheus to Gary Fosnaugh, who will assure proper follow up. Patrick will be working with Gary. Brian from Clatsop asked for clarification of the process at the state level for dealing with Syphilis Reactors. Are they processed via some kind of "reactor desk" before getting signed out? For example, Clatsop County gets a reactor (positive RPR) from Mult County to work up. There's very little data accompanying the report. The first thing Brian would want to do is see whether it's an pre-existing case. For now, call Gary at 971-673-0152 for assistance, when creating a Syphilis Reactor. Q: What is the state supposed to do with gonorrhea or chlamydia cases that are lost to treatment? Contact your state DIS, e.g. Kym in Lane, especially for gonorrhea.	State to provide State DIS County assignment list to LHDs. State to follow up on reverse contact training and appropriate disposition, i.e., "m."

	your e-mail program.  Running reports: Allyson from North Central inquired about Disease by Quarter totals and other STD-related reports that can be run to prepare for County Reviews. For the County review reports, only 7th floor CDs are programmed for county review reports.

7.	Outbreak Management Tools – Napoli and Shotgun – Hillary. Hillary presented an overview of Napoli, the point source outbreak investigation tool designed by the late Bill Keene. Its predecessor was Sleuth. The main difference between Sleuth and Napoli is that Napoli holds data from all that outbreaks, whereas Sleuth was designed for individual outbreaks. Napoli is on Citrix, so one doesn't need to run it locally. Tom Fitch is the Napoli developer. Typically, when you're asking the state to create a questionnaire, we would be matching it up with the data in Napoli. There are different ways to use Napoli depending on the study design, including matched case-control study. It calculates incubation periods, and has a variety of pre-programmed case definitions, as well as the ability to customize case definitions. It also has the ability to analyze, for example, anything that had lettuce on it in a Mexican restaurant. Hillary gave an overview of Napoli, including data entry system, how to set up a case definition, symptom coding, epi curve, reports, etc. Though Napoli is set up for quick 2 X 2 analyses, more complicated analyses would be better performed by exporting the data from Napoli and consumed by a more robust statistical package, such as SAS.

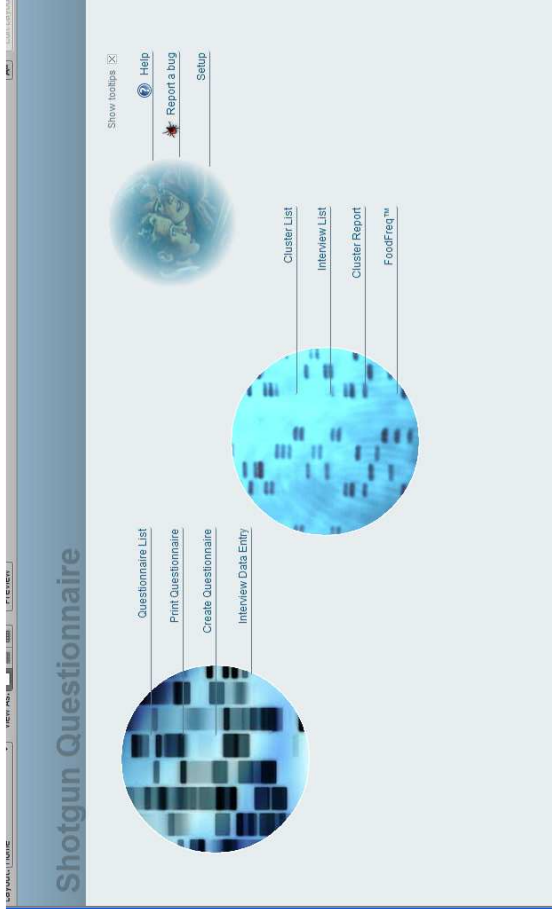
