
- **Do LHD users use the find mode in the outbreaks database?** Yes, people use find mode in outbreaks. This was the case with one instance that text was deleted. If you type will in find mode it is not being saved. If you use find mode be mindful of the fact that it is not saving the information.
- **Update to the attachment/documentation viewing in Outbreaks database.** The attachment tab now uses the same level of security that the editing of the outbreak record so you must be a participant of the outbreak. You can now store labs associated with an outbreak on the attachment area of the outbreak. Historically, we have saved these in a secured folder on the state network drive. This is not like the case log security because the case log is a separate database.
- Orpheus redesign royal Orpheus theme– beta button for Enterics- new defaults. After the interface replacement next Thursday, you will go to the new Royal Orpheus theme but can use the beta button to switch back.
- **Find issues? is the mysterious find happening.** Still occurring for some counties but does not last long. Hoping when we move to the royal Orpheus theme with all layouts this will resolve.
- Contact transfers should be resolved with interface replacement next Thursday. The work around it
 to have either tech team or the person whose case it is add the other county to the more tab to view
 the case.

Counties report that they do use find mode in outbreaks. Will pay attention when using it.
