

Item	Discussion/Decisions	Action items
1	Secure Export Location – Stephen - Attachments of documents often contain personably identifiable information. Orpheus "exports" the attached document, then it is opened, hence the importance of setting a secure export location. 94% of active users have set a secure export location – there are 22 users who still need to do so. Thanks to all who have already set a secure export location.	Users to set their export path (User Settings) ASAP if they haven't already done so; call Orpheus Tech if help is needed.
2	Electronic Laboratory Reporting updates/issues – Michelle - ELR module rebuild is underway. It's a heavy lift and will take several months to complete. - Actively building out ability to process electronic case reports.	Reminder: if you learn about a scanned or faxed lab that isn't accompanied by an ELR, then attach the document to the Case record, and send Michelle the Case ID.

3	Royal Orpheus layouts – common language for new areas to report issues - all – 5 min The Royal Orpheus transition is complete except for the several ELR components. June asked for feedback; one response – no problems.	Users to notify Michelle whenever encountering a "classic" Orpheus Layout.
4	 Triennial metrics Update – June – 5 min Metrics were updated last week. Animal bites had been used in the denominator and has been removed. The animal bites associated with PEP or that are being tested are the ones we're particularly interested in tracking. We removed pregnant woman with chronic hepatitis B from the calculations. We removed the 5 stool kit section from the long term care facility outbreaks section when symptom profile looks like norovirus. Kaplan criteria posted in previous minutes. 	Users to notify June or Tasha of any issues around Triennial Review metrics or calculations.
5	 (Race, Ethnicity, and Language – Disability) REAL-D update & training – Tom/June Workgroup is meeting tomorrow. Fields, including housing status, are live in Orpheus. The two on-line training videos have been completed and are slated for final review tomorrow; they will be posted to the learning center very soon. Alyssa McClean did a great job putting those together. 	Users to begin using the new field "Past yr housing"



- June demonstrated the REAL-D interfacing pointing out the free text fields. Americans would be "Other White."

Housing:

- Please refer to last month's minutes. Note that there is a place to hover over the housing field in the pop up:




- Note the Past yr housing field, which is not the traditional housing question we used to ask, rather, this question asks about the most severe housing situation they've had in the last year.
- The new race data are being joined with the historic race data. We will be
 developing new reports based on the REAL-D reports. Once again we want
 this to be SELF REPORTED race, not from a medical record or other source.

LHD interviewers to ask case about the most severe housing situation they've had in the last year to get at the Past yr housing question.

6 Pesticide Module – Crystal

- Background: Acute pesticide poisoning is a reportable condition. Reports come from a variety of sources including the poison center.



Crystal described the pesticide module. The forms work for CDC NIOSH and
the Federal Events Notification System for Occupational Risk. The purpose is
to build surveillance capacity. Eventually the surveillance data get sent to EPA
via NIOSH, to re-evaluate safety standards. Pesticide module is being
developed. Crystal pointed out the PEST and PARC fields for cross-reference
used by other governmental agencies.




Crystal to un-check the keep active checkbox to remove the cases from users' home screens.

Users to set LHD completion date as the same date as the received date for pesticide poisoning cases.

There is no need for Counties to investigate pesticide poisonings.

	 Investigation Guidelines are forthcoming. Michelle added that a user's security permissions requires the Environmental Exposures disease group is required to view pesticide poisonings. Crystal expects about 100 cases per year. June noted that we would NOT include pesticide poisonings in any county review reports or metrics. 	The bug that Crystal reported referring to the home screen had to do with the inadvertent importation of historic pesticide poisoning data, which showed up on users' home screens.
7	 Tick survey update ACDP Epis, Oregon Dept of Ag, Douglas County and Curry County epis worked with CDC et al to collect <i>Dermacentor occidentalis</i> ticks in five counties (northernmost range of D. occidentalis) to look for Rickettsia 364D, which was recently discovered in northern California resident. CSTE's new position statement for spotted fever group rickettsioses (SPGR) includes a 1:128 IgG cutoff instead of the 1:64, which will exclude a lot of chronic cases. We'll also be reporting SFGR annually to CDC instead of weekly. 	
8	 Animal Bites Reporting – Stephen 1 (17%) of 6 calls into ACDP pertain to animal bites Animal bites represent an excellent use-case for electronic case reporting (eCR) Orpheus (Michelle et al.) can handle eCRs

	Christina (Tillamook) Do animal bites seen in emergency rooms automatically get imported in Orpheus? No, but we're hoping to do that with electronic case reporting.	
	Aren't they coming in through ESSENCE? Yes, but not at the case reporting level.	
	Michelle explained that we at the state will give the hospital ICD 10 codes for them to flag and send electronic case reports.	
9	 Data Visualization Project – Stephen We at the state are in the early stages of leveraging Tableau as much as possible for visualizing Orpheus data. OHA has data visualization as a high priority. 	
	- The annual report is first on the list, after which high-usage Orpheus reports.
