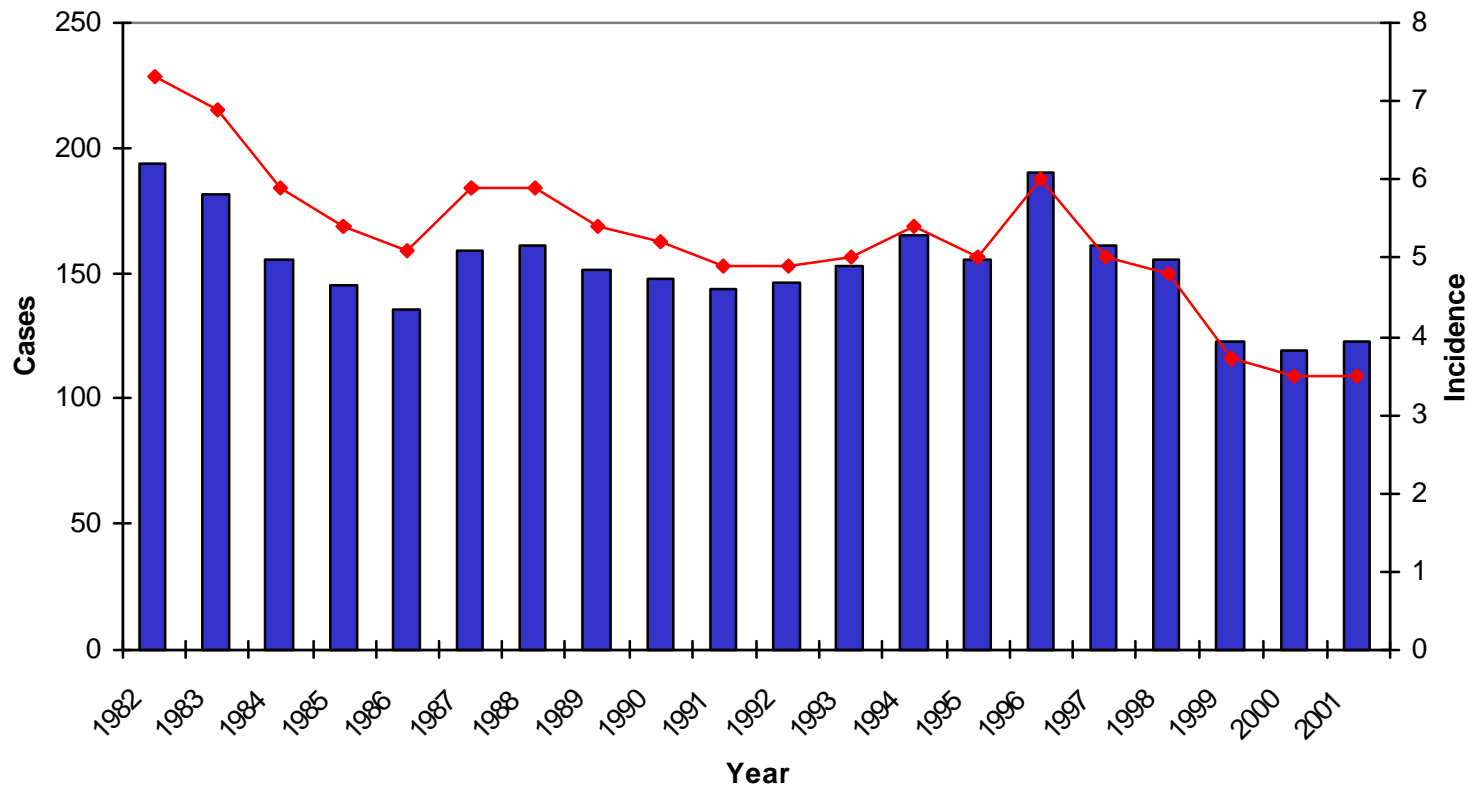


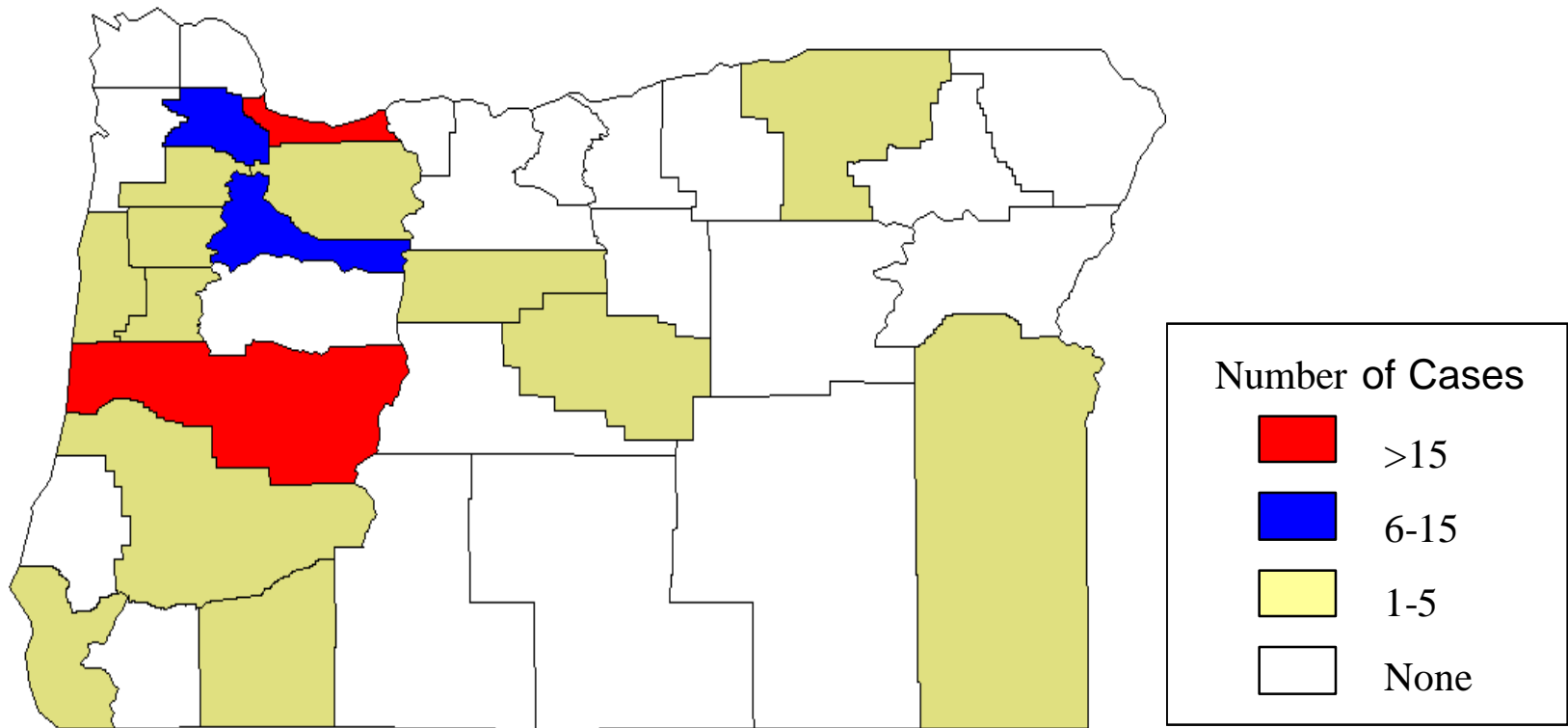

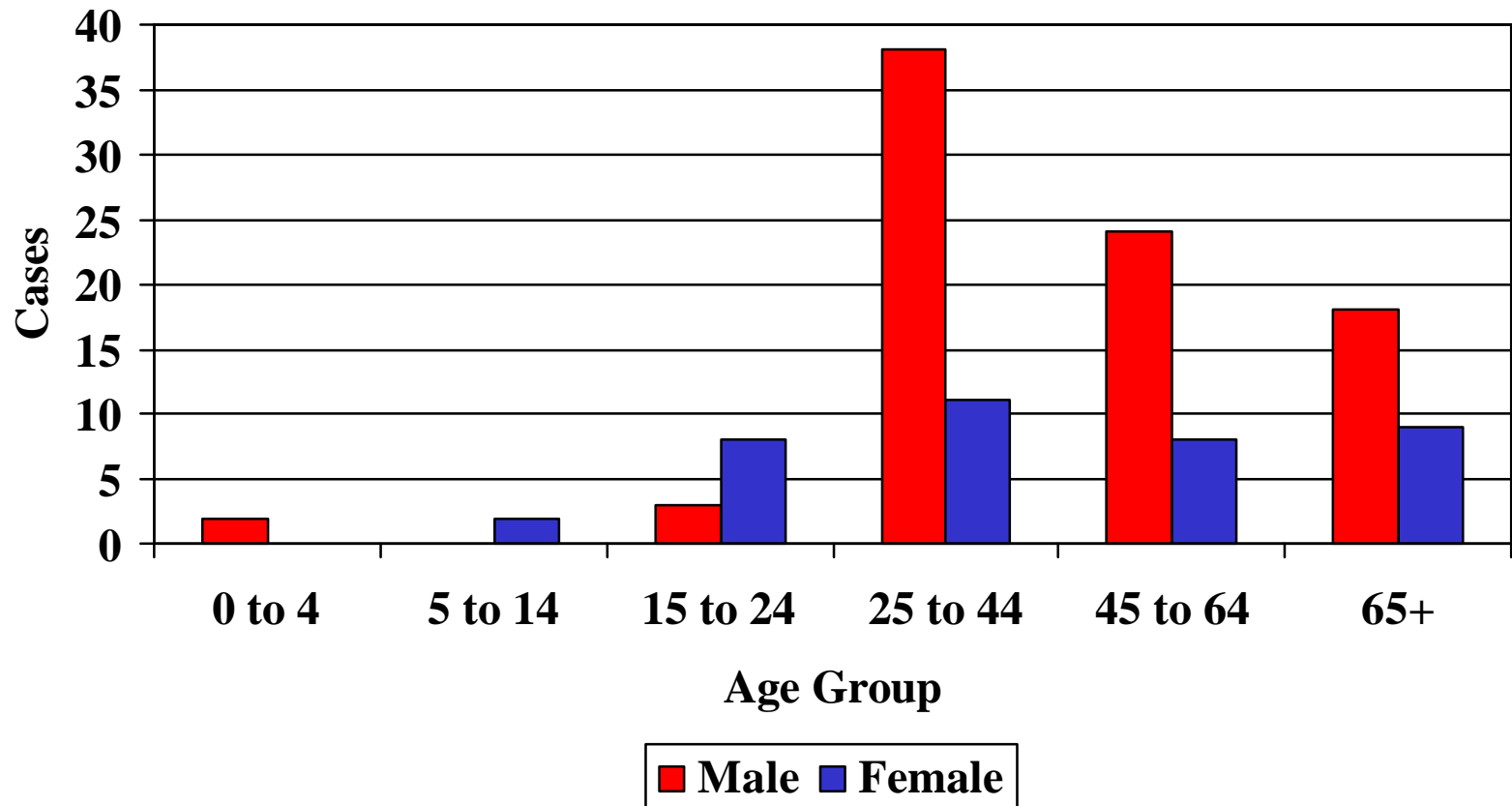
TB Cases by County of Residence Oregon, 2001

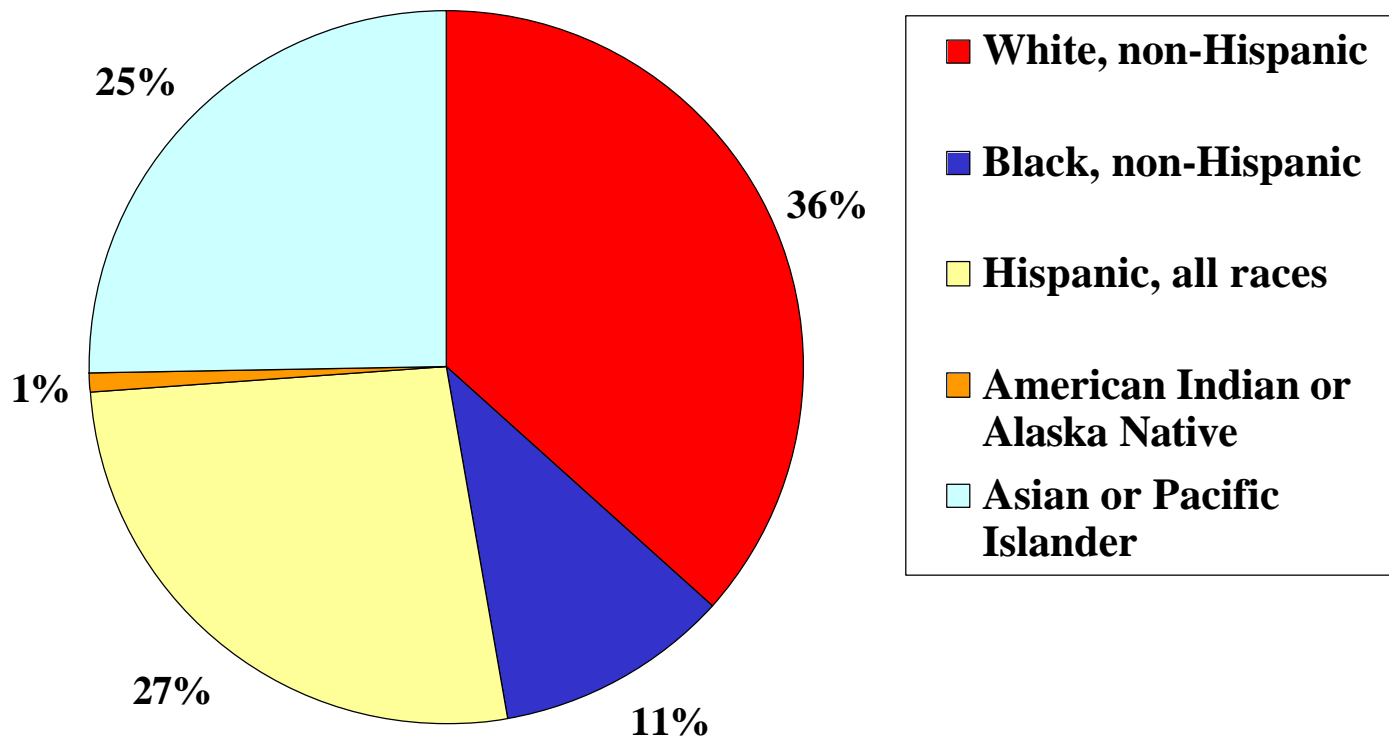

TB Cases by Gender & Age Oregon, 2001

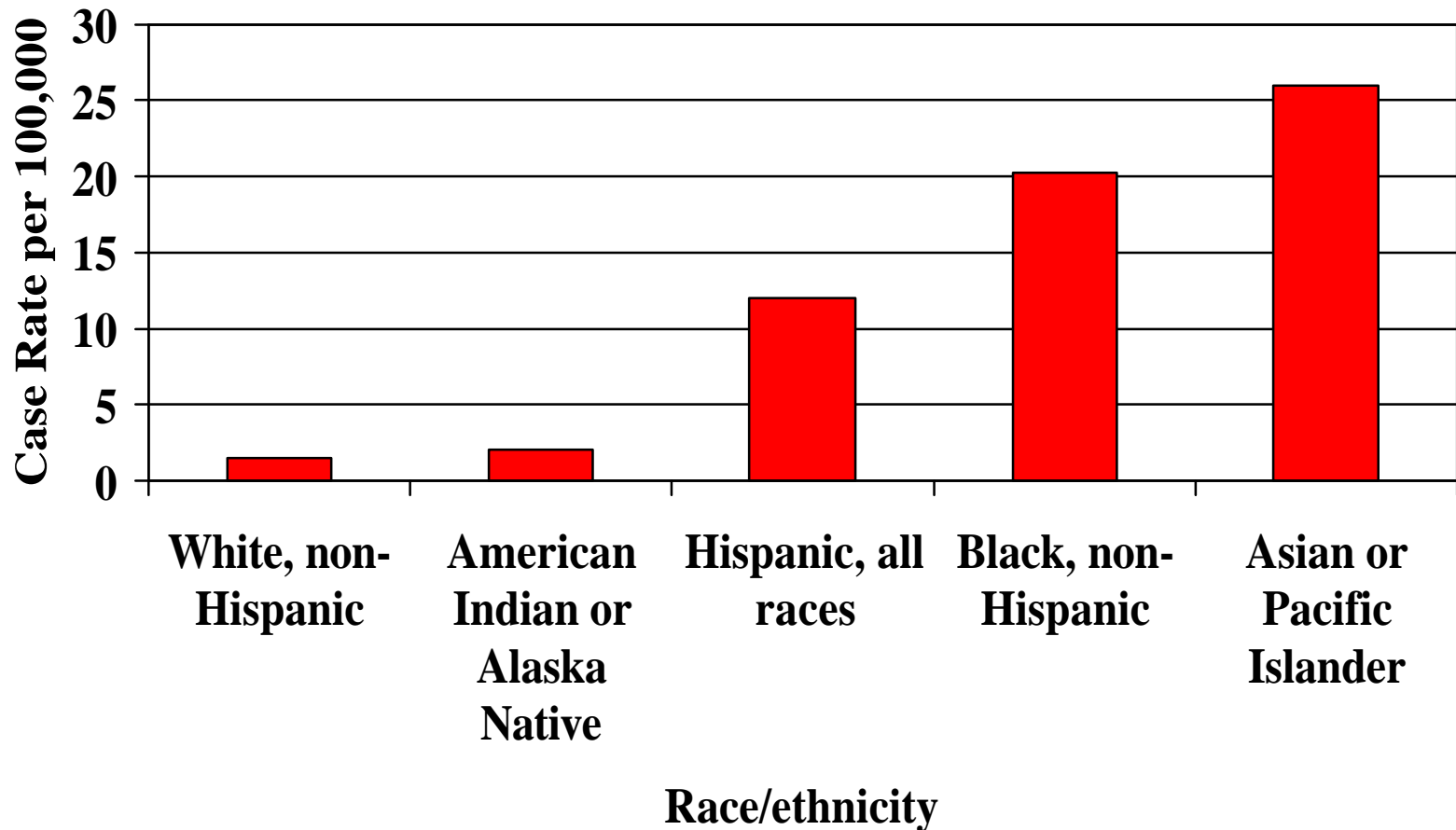


TB Cases by Race & Ethnicity

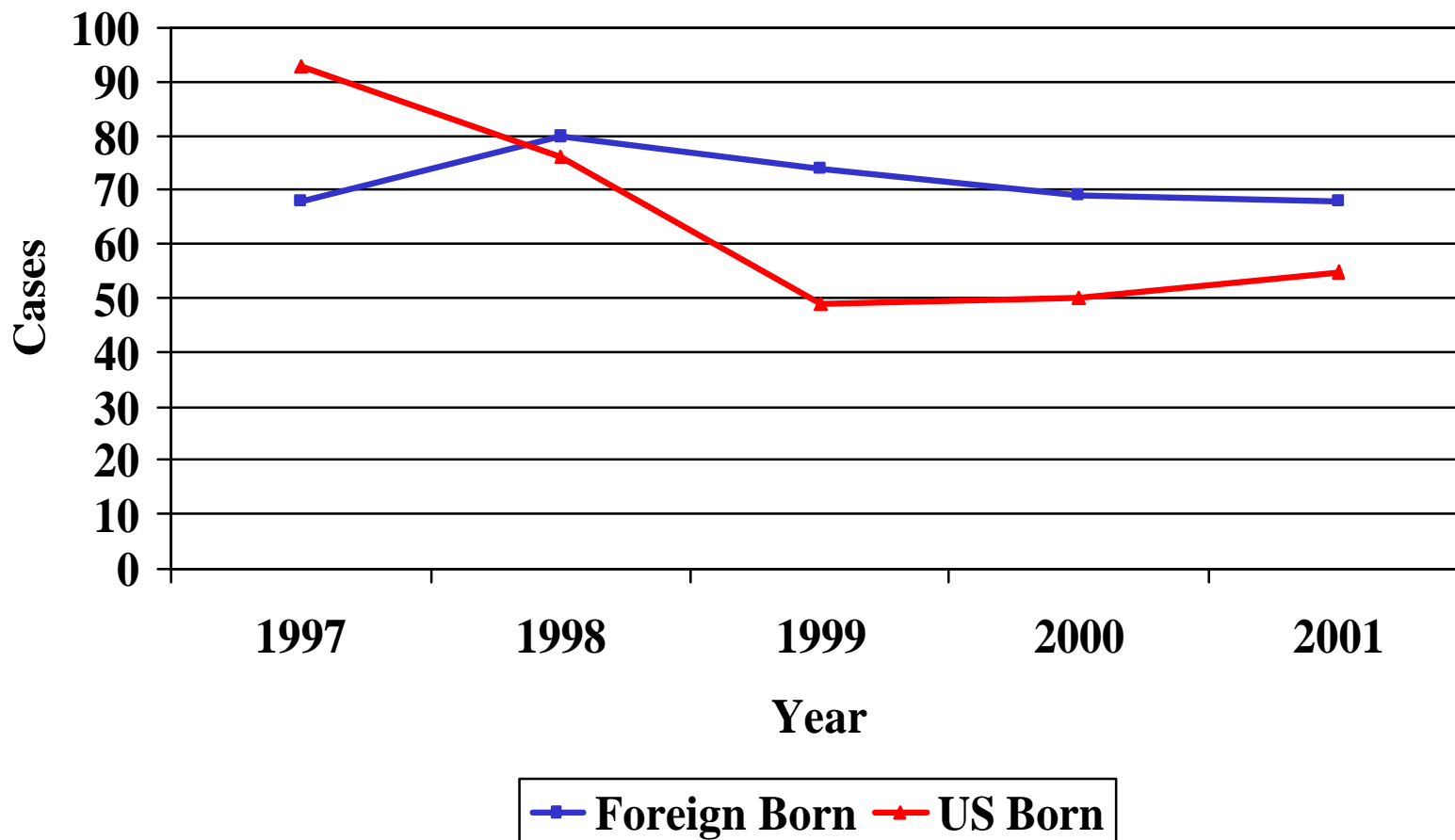

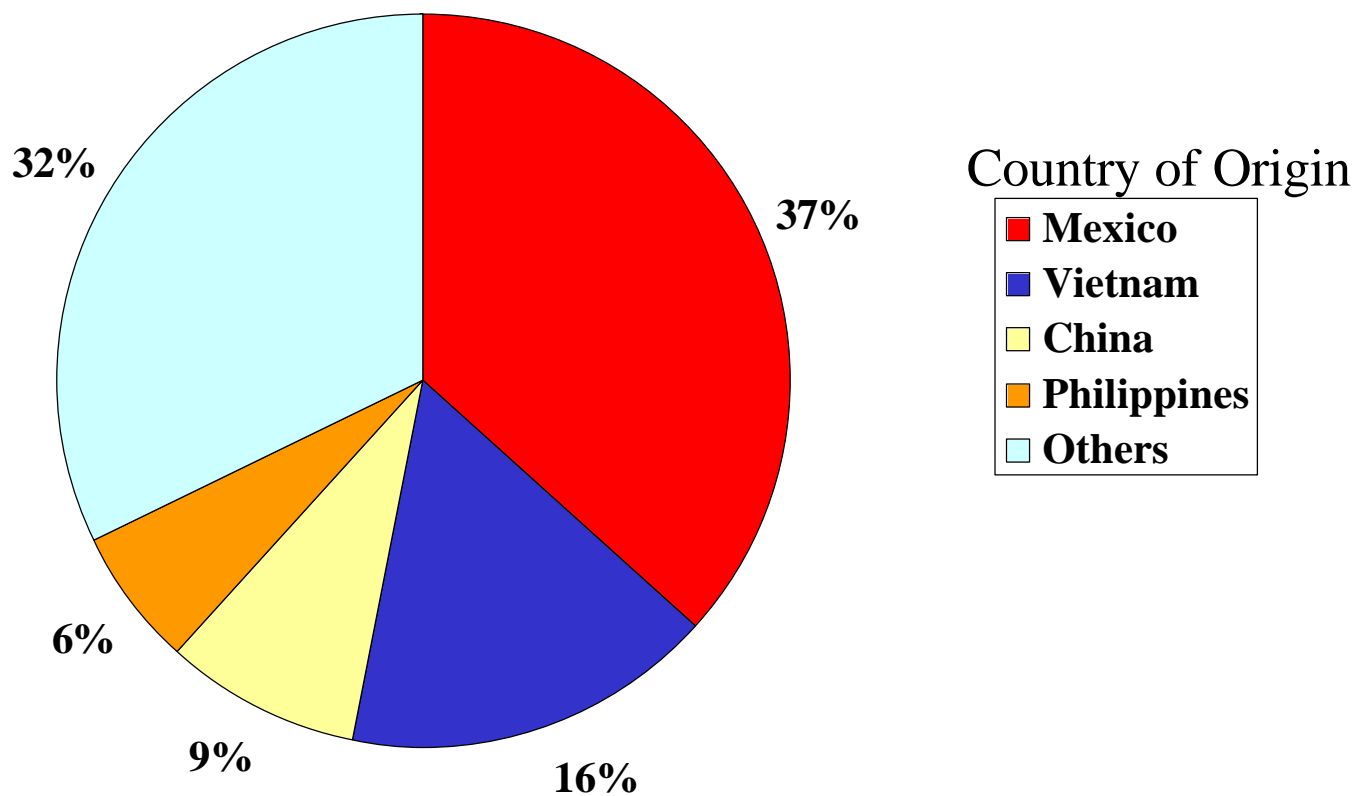
TB Case Rates by Race & Ethnicity Oregon, 2001



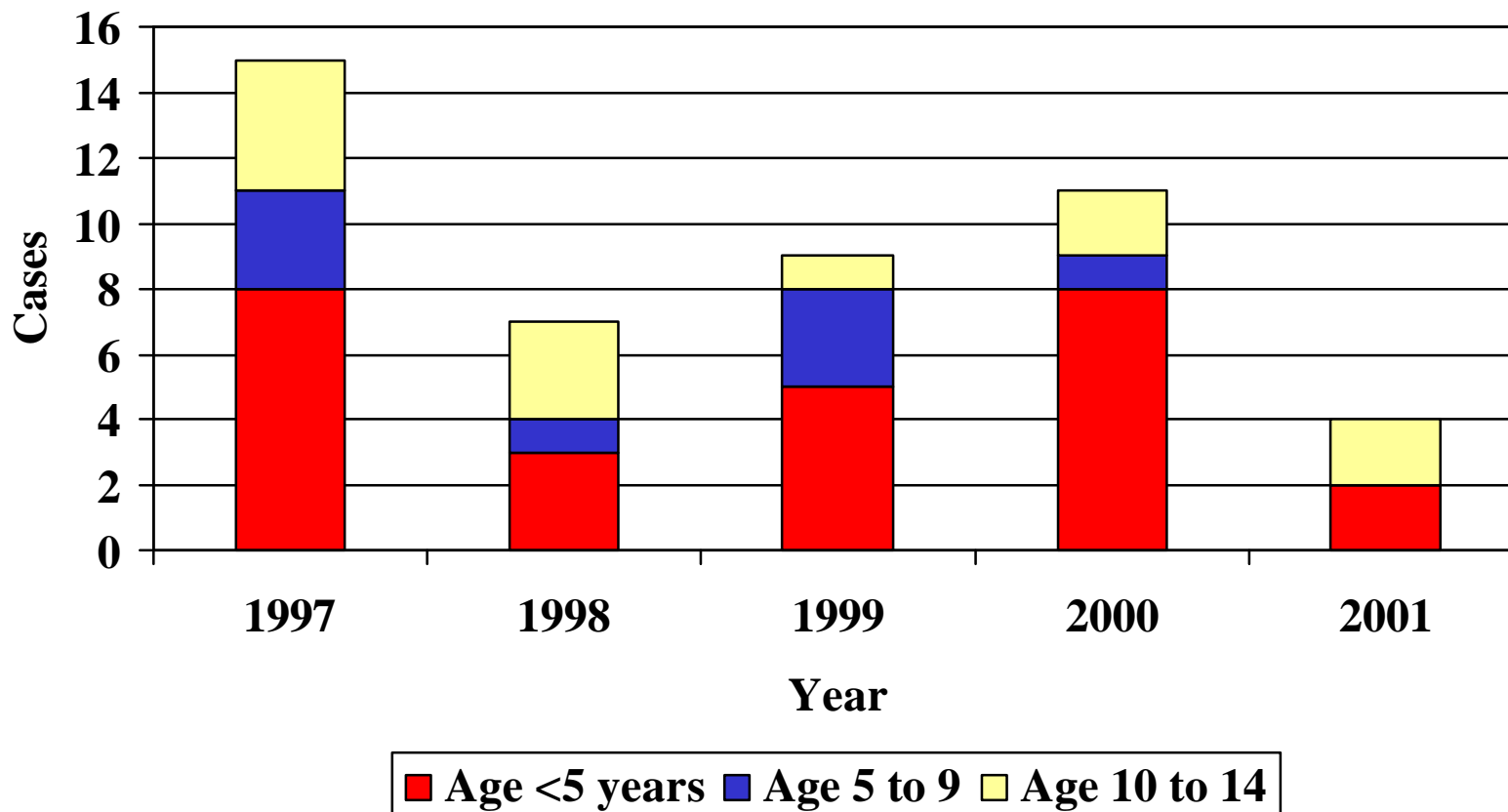
TB Cases by Origin Oregon 1997-2001



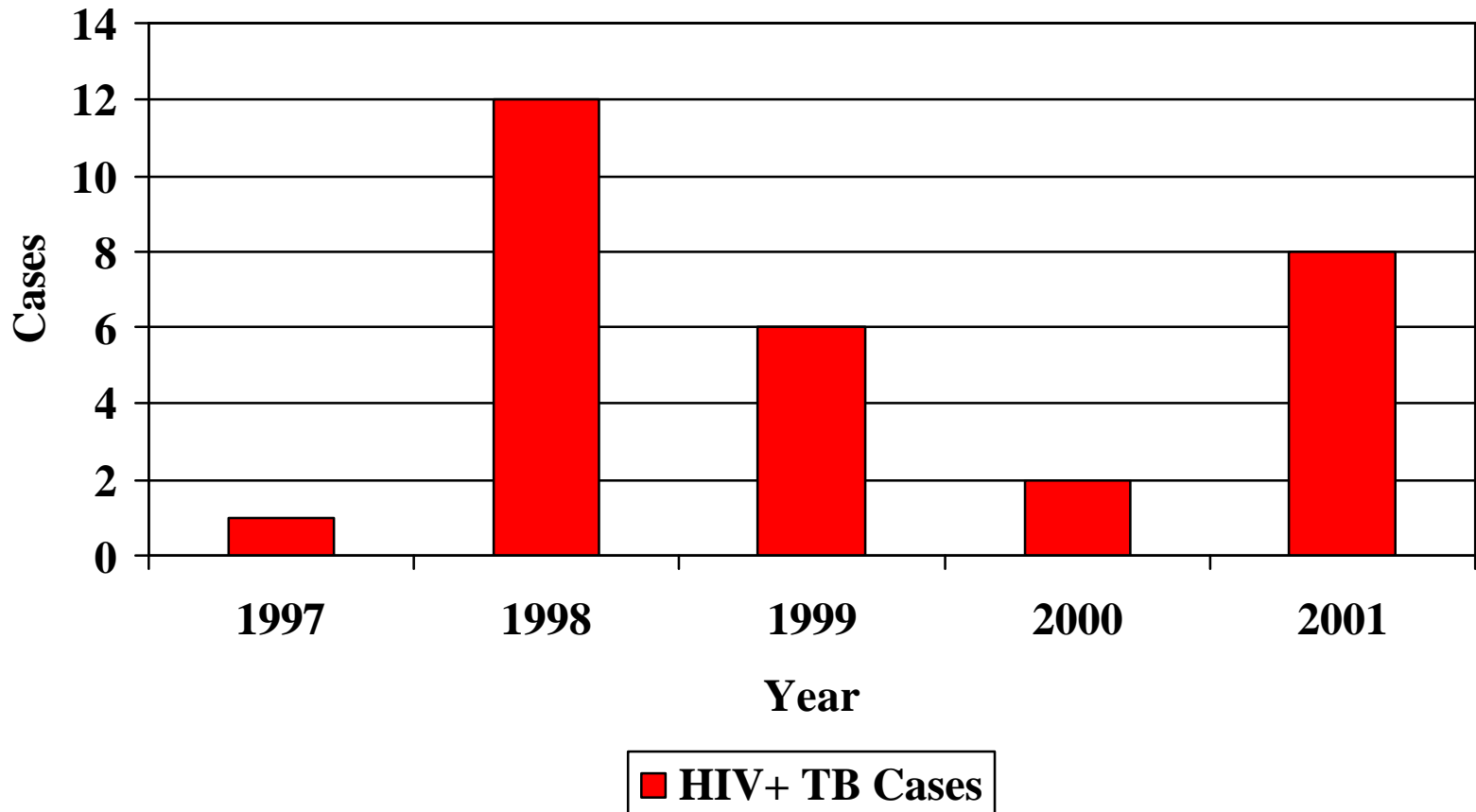
Foreign Born TB Cases by Country Oregon, 2001



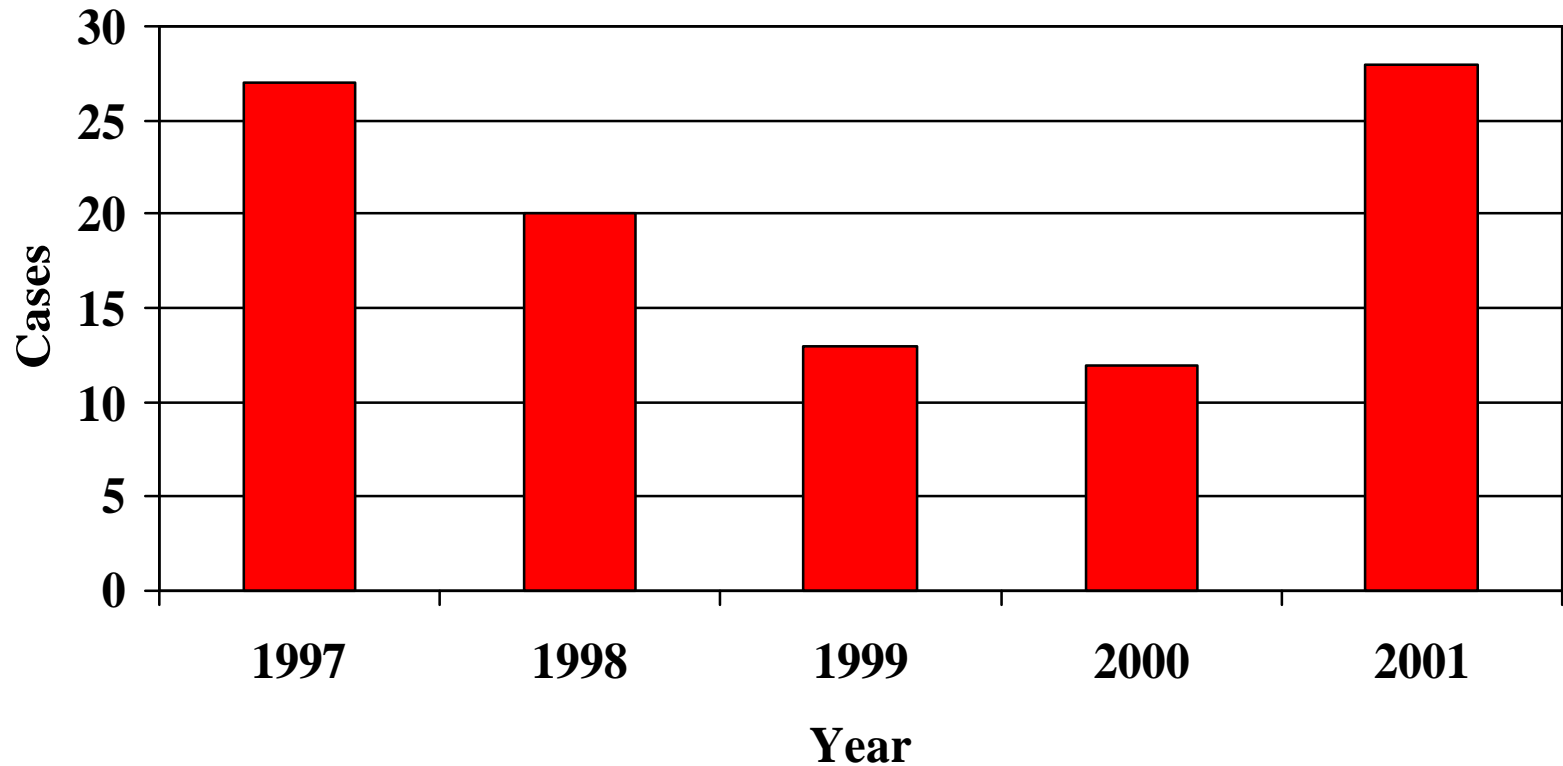
Pediatric TB Cases Oregon, 1997-2001



TB/HIV Co-Morbidity Oregon, 1997-2001

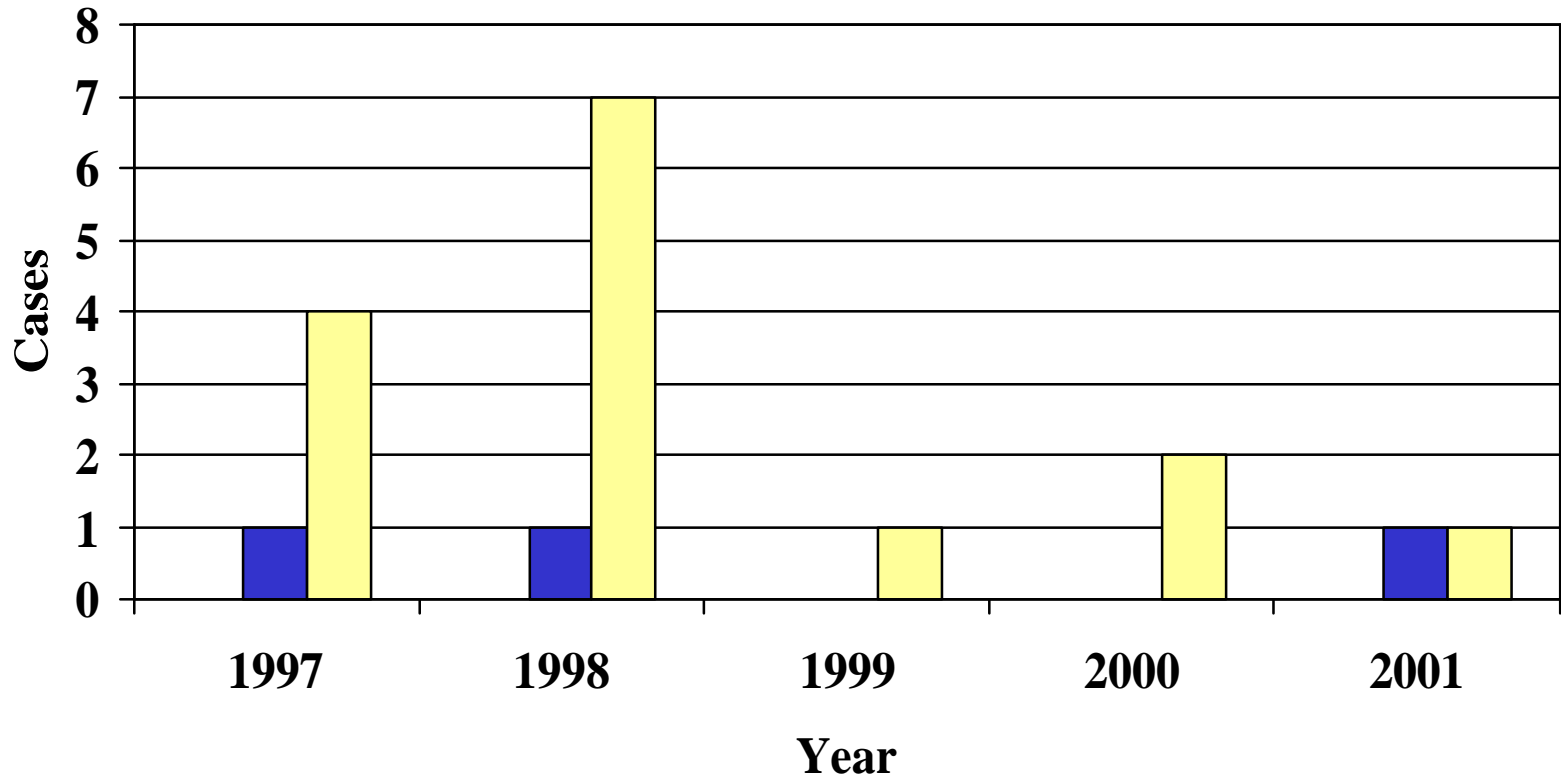


Homelessness in TB Cases Oregon, 1997-2001



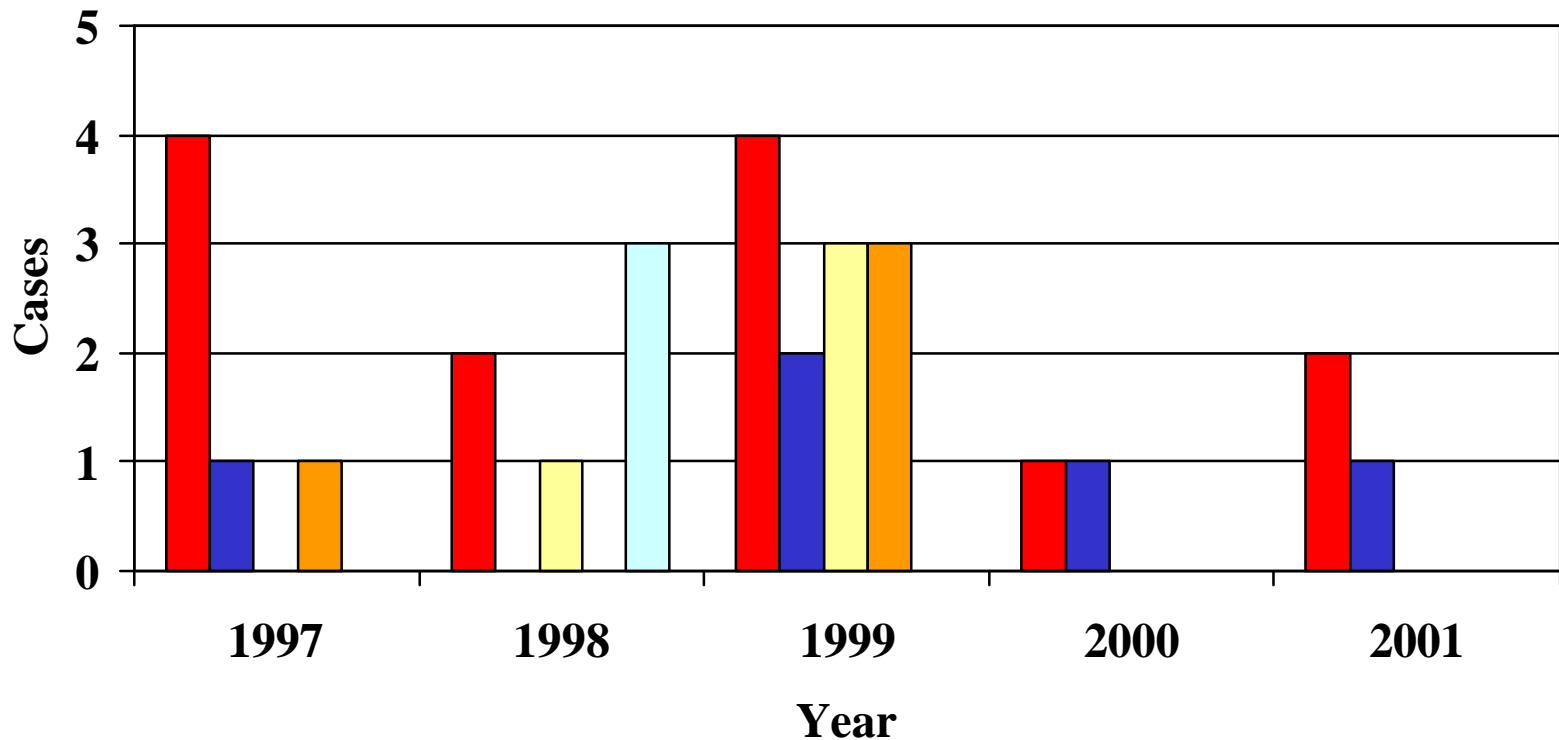

TB Cases in Correctional Facilities Oregon 1997-2001



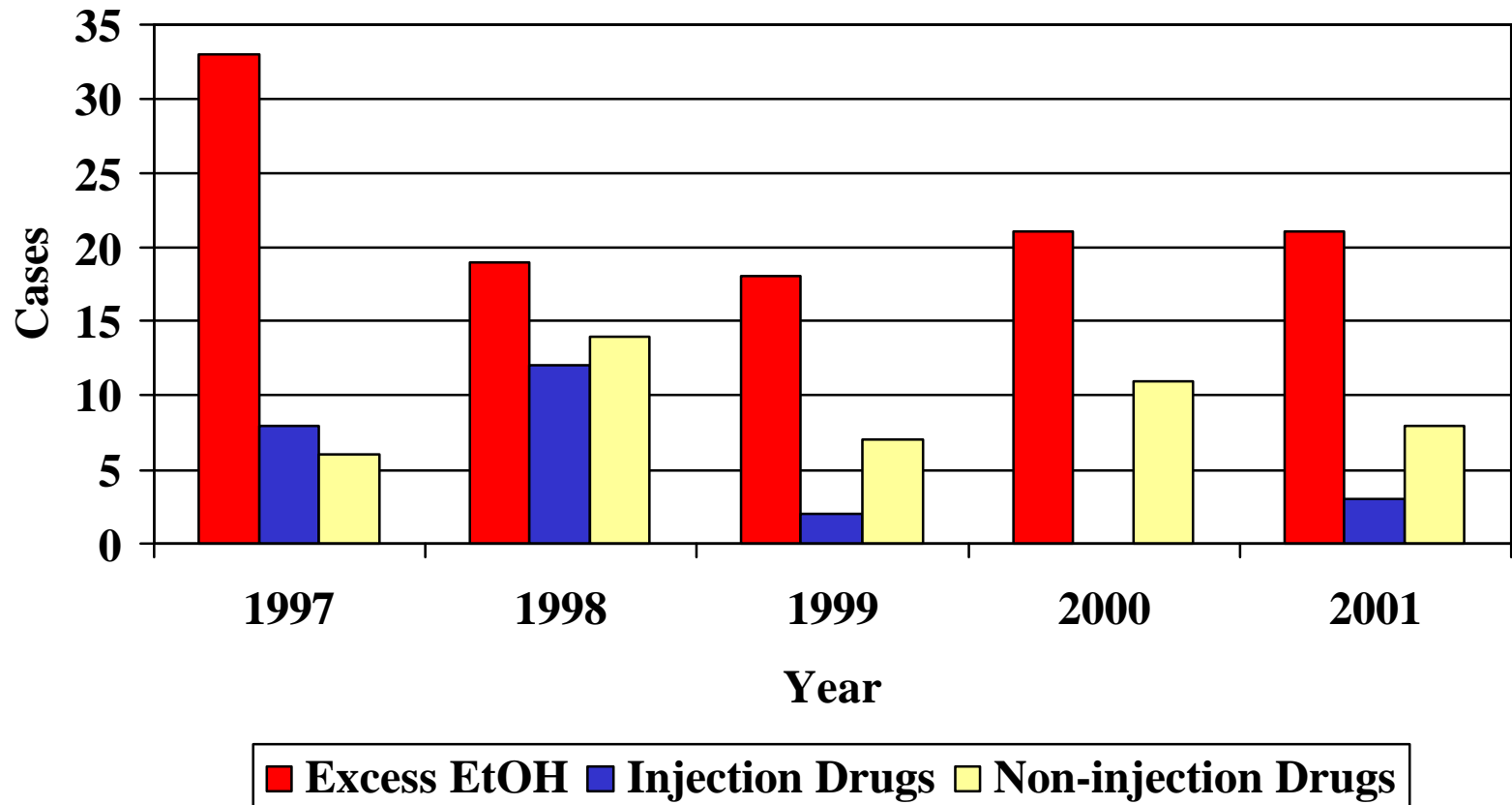

TB Drug Resistance Patterns Oregon 2001

- 1 (1%) Multi-drug resistant (MDR) cases
MDR = isoniazid (INH) and rifampin (RM) resistant
- 18 (20%) Resistant to at least one TB drug
 - 8 (9%) at least INH resistant
 - Other drugs: streptomycin, pyrazinamide, and ethionamide
